

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism: For children under 5, please contact the Parish Office (273-8113) for an appointment to speak with a Priest or Deacon at least several weeks before the Baptism. For older children, contact the Office of Family Faith Formation (231-7344).

First Holy Communion: Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

Confirmation: This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of the Sick: Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament is celebrated every weekday at 5:00p.m. also Saturday from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Church and at 8:30a.m. and 10:30 a.m. on Sundays or by appointment by calling the business office 631-273-8113.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Marriage: Congratulations! Couples planning to marry should make an appointment with a Priest or Deacon at least eight (8) months in advance of the wedding to allow time for adequate preparation.

Holy Orders: Is God calling you? Call a Priest or Deacon to discern a possible vocation to the Priesthood, Diaconate or the Religious life.

3RD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

We are preparing for Christmas; the season of the year and of the Church that is the most popular and very rich in expressing its significance. Christ' birth affects every being in the world directly or indirectly, but he is the Savior of all. He gently invites all into his friendship, and Advent is the time for us to prepare and not to miss the opportunity to meet him as he comes. There are signs and steps on that way, and one of them is Santa Claus. It is not a fantasy, it is not a tale. It refers to Saint Nicholas, that is real and true person that existed in the middle of the third century, born in 270 and died in 343, he served as bishop of Myrna which is located in Turkey, Asia Minor. Today the remains, the relics of Saint Nicholas are preserved in Bari, Italy, in a church shared by Catholic and Orthodox Churches. The two feast are celebrated in some countries in honor of Saint Nicholas, one is on December 6th that refers to date marking his death, and on May 9th that refers to transferring his remains to Italy after Asia Minor was invaded by Muslim occupants.

Saint Nicholas was a great gift giver, and it comes from the fact that he was helping young brides to get married by helping and providing them with material help—making it possible to marry with better possibilities and perspectives. As a Saint he had as well God given gifts of making miracles, and intercessory prayer to accomplish what people were seeking in faith from God. So definitively he was the Saint that helped people's dreams to be fulfilled, so it is totally proper and realistic that anyone, specially children should ask Santa Claus, Saint Nicholas, Saint Mikolaj, San Nicola, Saint Nikolaos to help them to live their dreams. This is the origins and significance of our gift giving for Christ. In the past when the world was poorer, it was all simpler, healthier. Now when commercialism rules, it distorts the meaning and even denies the existence of Saint Nicholas as origin of Christmas gifts giving.

Christmas first gift to all is Jesus, he is the reason for the season. His biggest gift to us is salvation that he brings with him. It is a gift for those who believe and it's significance we learn from the account of Christ himself in the Gospel, and from the witness of those who had seen it with their own eyes or heard it from witnesses and wrote it for our instruction. Account of Christ' birth surely was given to Evangelists by Blessed Mother herself. So Christ is the reason for the season and it is proper to give gifts to others without forgetting the significance of it.


In today's Gospel Jesus gives answer to John' question: "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?", but the answer is not direct affirmation or negation. The answer that Jesus gives points to the Scriptures, describing Jesus' actions and deeds as expected from the Messiah, the Anointed One. So basically Jesus says: watch my deeds and read the Sacred Scriptures and make a decision yourself, because that decision will show how much you believe. It will show in your deeds and words as it showed in mine. Jesus is not going to make decisions for us. He told us all that he heard from his Father, and he showed us how much he loves us and cares, and now it's time for our response; our time to show how much we love and care about him. So all is in our hands, and to make us think, Jesus praises John the Baptist as greatest man ever born and says that: " the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he ". Do you believe this what Jesus said, that you and I are greater than John the Baptist? He says the truth but it's hard to believe it until we find the meaning of what Jesus wanted to say. And again, he is not giving us straight answer, but he makes us to watch the deeds of John the Baptist, hear what he has to say, read the Sacred Scriptures about him, and than make our decision in what way it is true, and how it affects our life. So let us put ourselves to task, to know and to understand the relationship between John the Baptist, Jesus and us.

For that task I bless You All !!!! Let us include Blessed Mother in that relationship and she may help us to understand it better, as she was right there and she had to get those answers for herself.


