### **SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION**

**Baptism:** For children under 5, please contact the Parish Office (273-8113) for an appointment to speak with a Priest or Deacon at least several weeks before the Baptism. For older children, contact the Office of Family Faith Formation (231-7344).

**First Holy Communion:** Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

**Confirmation:** This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

### **SACRAMENTS OF HEALING**

**Sacrament of the Sick:** Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

**Reconciliation:** The Sacrament is celebrated every week-day at 5:00p.m. also Saturday from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Church and at 8:30a.m. and 10:30 a.m. on Sundays or by appointment by calling the business office 631-273-8113.

### **SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION**

**Marriage:** Congratulations! Couples planning to marry should make an appointment with a Priest or Deacon at least eight (8) months in advance of the wedding to allow time for adequate preparation.

**Holy Orders:** Is God calling you? Call a Priest or Deacon to discern a possible vocation to the Priesthood, Diaconate or the Religious life.

### **DEVOTIONS**

**Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament:** Each Thursday from 12:30 PM until 5:15 PM. First Friday from 5:30 PM until 7:00 PM. Rosary after the 12:00 daily Mass.

**Miraculous Medal Novena:** Monday after the 12:00 Mass and First Saturday from 8:15 - 9:00 AM.

# A Message from your Pastor

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

The summer is moving to an end as we approach September and children will go back to school, and things will move on in normal, working mood rather than vacation spirit. But following Christ is always fun and Christ brings us to celebrate and to feast at least once a week on Sunday and in fact He invites us to live our lives in constant spirit of gratitude and thanksgiving.

That can be done, but in order to arrive there we need to learn to see our life with the eyes of faith. As Apostle Paul tells us second reading we are approaching "the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and countless angels in festal gathering ..... and the sprinkled blood that speaks more eloquently than that of Abel. "

We are part of something much bigger than ourselves, than our life, than the reality of this passing world. God's love is not affected by time, but we are. We are called to maturity of faith and of love. Is our love perfect ??? Is our human maturity full ???

Lord, please give us the humility to serve You and to serve others, give us the humility to see that we truly are part of a heavenly family, sprinkled and redeemed by your blood. Let us start today and everyday, let us see the half full glass of blessings in our lives, and let's keep working on making it full.

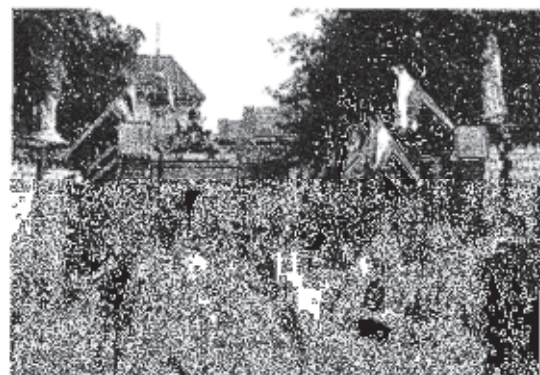

It tasted like a vanilla pudding with a water in the middle of it.

**MICHAEL:** We all loved it and wished that our family and long loved could try it too.

**BRITNEY:** We finished our cake and then strolled the streets of the square, caught a few sunset, and shared some of the special pins we had brought with us to trade.

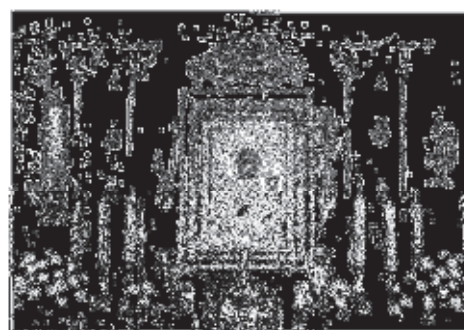
**MICHAEL:** While walking back to the bus we ran into Father Stan!

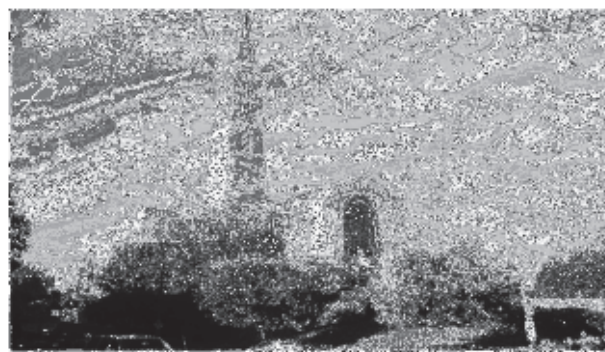

Also please be sure to pack a lunch or plan on buying it in the cafeteria at the Shrine. We will stop on the way down to use the bathroom facilities only.

We will be leaving Washington, D.C. by 5:30p.m. to return to Brentwood and we will stop on the way home for a quick bite to eat. Pack your snacks, water and juices will be available on the bus if needed. Any questions call Marge at the Business Office 631-273-8113 ex. 216.

During the month of July, we were able to assist 100 families. Within those 100 families, there were 27 seniors, 133 adults and 116 children. We had 16 new families. Thanks to your donations we were able to give our clients food and the extra toiletries they need.

We are concentrating our efforts on supplying our outreach children with the basic school necessities to get a fresh start in September. The school supply list for the Brentwood schools is quite extensive and expensive. Here are some of the items: 2-pocket folders (laminated or plastic), 1" & 2" binders, loose leaf paper, construction paper, pens, #2 Ticonderoga pencils, pencil cases, highlighters, scissors, dry erase markers and erasers, thin washable markers, 24 count Crayola crayons, rulers, post-its, glue sticks, ruled index cards, black & white composition notebooks and 3 subject & 5 subject spiral notebooks. Please consider a small donation to help us give a child those needed school supplies. These school supplies will be distributed at the end of August to the children of our outreach clients.



The following items are always needed: soup, jelly (small jars), cereal, toilet paper, tissues, paper towels, shampoo, conditioner, bar soap, body wash, deodorant, toothpaste, tooth brushes, disposable razors, shaving cream, disposable diapers sizes 3, 4 and 5, baby wipes, dish detergent, laundry detergent, pet food and travel-size toiletries.

When items are available at our outreach, we are able to give our clients gently used clothing, towels and bedding. Our clients are very grateful for these extra items. All of your donations are truly appreciated by those who cannot afford to purchase them on their own.

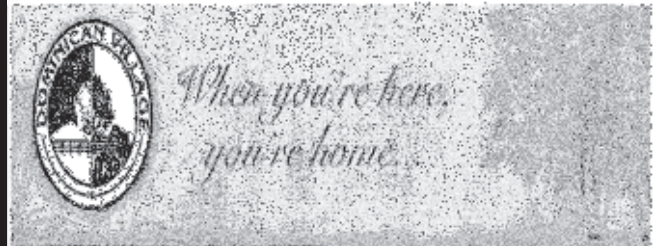
