

20th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

As you know the bulletin is printed for us normally around Thursday, to be delivered on time for Saturday. Sometimes when there is a holiday during the week, it may be prepared by Marge for print even a week before. I remind you of it just to let you realize, that not always it is possible to put last moment things or write about events that happen just over the weekend. So it is with this Saturday's visit of Cardinal Gregorio from El Salvador. We will have had that visit first, than we will share our experiences, but that is the reason why we try to advertise all our events, so that those interested would be able to participate in them.

It is good to participate in spiritual and cultural events. It is edifying in every way, imagine participating in any event that Jesus was present at? Wouldn't that be fun and heart touching? Life changing experience? If we have things to say about: times and culture, spirituality and society, we need to ask ourselves what we have done to enrich it, and to make it better, how many people have we won for Christ? We have to make it our aim to continue to step out of ourselves, and humbly bring people to God, and to sanctification of humanity in us and in others.

This event is culture crossing, and a surprise even to Salvadorians who never had a Cardinal, who also is not the principal Bishop of their Diocese. His coming to our diverse parish community is a message of universality of the Church, and a challenge to the universality of our culture, not to stop to be enriched by multicultural origin of all of us. What makes us one more than anything else is our faith, which blends us into brotherhood and sisterhood beyond blood relationships. It makes us truly God's family. Each one of us is invited to act like brother and sister towards the other.

Today's readings speak about the universality of God's love. God expressed his predilection for the people of Israel not to make them racists, but to make them aware of the special love for those who correspond to God's plan and order of love and creation. That predilection is open to all, even to the stranger who would respect the order of God's Love. Love is about corresponding to the gift of self by the one who is gifted towards the originator of the gift. But that gift of love may be rejected, trampled underfoot as Jesus comments about, giving the pearls to the pigs, they will never be able to appreciate them. So this is why God's love, is revealed love, first to Abraham and through him to us and all those who believe and correspond to it. By ourselves we wouldn't find God's love because of our blindness of sin. It is God that steps towards us and than we can return to God in act of love.

Saint Paul quickly came to the realization, that God's message of salvation is for all people, as he had recognized that God has given the gift of Holy Spirit to them with the gift of faith. Jesus knowing the cultural differences and resentments of Jewish people with people of other nations, puts to test the faith of the Canaanite woman, and her faith didn't fail. She didn't take offense at Jesus' comment, but removed the obstacle of cultural prejudice by even greater faith and humility. Today's media would condemn Jesus by his political incorrectness, overlooking his action and message by focusing on apparent disrespect that was masking Jesus' love for this woman of faith and her child.

Often we feed our ego with our apparent righteousness when it is convenient for us, and overlooking crimes with silence and inaction when it would require too much of involvement on our part. We should be resenting evil, and evil behavior, but we have to be merciful to the persons acting in wrong ways. Mercy has to motivate our actions. Jesus died for us when we were still sinners, He died for us when we were still lost. How much more witness of love do we need?

Let us examine our cultural, political, nationalistic, religious prejudices towards others, and let us have courage to confront them in ourselves, so that we may be truly be free to love God and our neighbor as ourselves

On June 28, 2017, Pope Francis created a Salvadoran Auxiliary Bishop a Cardinal. His Eminence, Jose Gregorio Cardinal Rosa Chavez dedicated his appointment as El Salvador's first Catholic Cardinal to the living memory of his close personal friend Blessed Archbishop Oscar Romero who was shot to death in 1980 at the beginning of the 12 year Salvadoran civil war as he celebrated Mass in a hospital chapel. The Cardinal is familiar to us in the Diocese of Rockville Centre because he has made pastoral visits to the local community here on Long Island and celebrated Masses.

We, the Catholic Church on Long Island, have invited Cardinal Rosa Chavez to celebrate this historic occasion and will be with us for a variety of Masses, pastoral visits and special events from Friday, August 18 - Monday, August 21, 2017. We have a number of pastoral missionary goals in these days of celebration with Cardinal Rosa Chavez:

- To deepen our love for Father, Son and Holy Spirit, to celebrate the global missionary spirit of Pope Francis and Cardinal Rosa Chavez and to promote dramatic missionary growth on Long Island.
- To raise consciousness and inspiration about the heroic life and sanctity of martyr Blessed Archbishop Oscar Romero and to pray together for his canonization.
- 3) To promote, in a spirit of pastoral charity, comprehensive immigration reform for our nation that is built on the principles of the dignity of the human person, social justice, the sanctity of human life and the family, and a love for the poor.
- 4) To promote a Culture of Life as a response to gang violence and its Culture of Death, specifically by comforting and supporting grieving families and by appealing for the conversion of the hearts, minds and souls of gang members.
- 5) To promote a vibrant Youth Ministry and expand Catholic Education opportunities for our vibrant Hispanic community and to foster a strong Catholic identity and fidelity to the Sunday Mass for the younger generation and all future generations.

The generosity of the parishioners of St. Anne Parish allows us to reach out to people in our Brentwood/Bay Shore neighborhood who struggle every day to make ends meet. Our pantry shelves are *very sparsely filled*. If each parishioner brought in one non-perishable food item, it would help us to feed the hungry in our community.

Thank you to all who donate to our food pantry. During July 2017, we were happy to assist 142 families, 28 seniors, 201 adults and 160 children. We also helped 11 new families.

Here are some items our pantry needs this month: soup, Goya beans, cereal, jelly, juices, pasta, sauce, rice, toilet paper, tissues, paper towels, shampoo, conditioner, body wash, soap, deodorant, toothpaste, shaving cream, disposable razors, diapers (size 4 & 5), baby wipes, feminine hygiene products, pet food and laundry detergent.

We are requesting school supplies for the school year 2017-2018. The supply list is always very extensive: composition notebooks, #2 Ticonderoga pencils, pencil sharpeners, pens, crayons, glue, glue sticks, Fiscar scissors, highlighters, dry erase markers, thin washable markers, rulers, 3x5 ruled index cards, pencil cases, 1"and 2" binders, loose leaf paper, 2-pocket folders (laminated or plastic), lunch bags and backpacks.

Any donated school supply item is gratefully appreciated.

There are boxes in our church near the statue of St. Anne for you to drop off your donated items.




