27th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

How blessed we are with this fall nature that gives itself to us for enjoyment. It is not hot and it is not cold, it is just right. The colors of trees are starting to change, the days are becoming shorter. It feels more like a family time, as children are well into school year and catechism classes, with their homework and commitments to different activities. How blessed we are to have our family and our community stand by us, how blessed we are to share our blessings with each other. We are going to have another long weekend with Columbus Day, celebrating the arrival of Christopher Columbus in Americas on October 12, 1492. That historic event began dramatic change in the history of the world, affecting all nations and cultures for ever after. We are part of that process even today. We can make different comments about effects of it on different peoples and populations. We need to support native Americans who were dramatically affected by all events after, given that European cultures proved to be dominant and no one could stop the process of cultural mix since. There are great things to learn from Pre- Columbian cultures in America. Their sense of brotherhood and strong believe in God. Their high knowledge of astronomy, and their sense of common use of the Mother Earth with no sense of private property, everything was a common good for use of all.



No one can stop those processes of domination and assimilation of one culture by the other. We can see it happening in our own times, in front of our own eyes and one individual is almost helpless, as those dynamics depend on those who are creating opinions and perceptions that push the culture into this or that direction. As we can see it today, that Religion and Common Culture are in a constant war for the influence over peoples lives, and none of them is the sole shaping force in the world. It's a constant pressure of both on the minds of peoples to go this or that way. On our own times we can see how difficult it is to defend the truth and right, taking the example of abortion as killing of our own children where one may seem helpless to stand against the TRENDS of times, so it is and it was with many historical transformations of cultures and peoples. What remains for us today, is to try to be just and respectful towards each other, defending our fundamental rights to life and liberty. As Jesus said: that we will come to know the truth, and the truth will set us free. Free to live, free to love, free to believe.

As we ponder our blessings and express our gratitude for them to God, we can't not see the hurts and brokenness of the world around us. One thing we see is the roaring nature of hurricanes and earthquakes and we thank God for all responders to those disasters who try to save lives. We thank God for people, that try to reach out to each other with helping hand. We ourselves try to help and share our resources by participation in collections done for the relief purposes supported by our Diocese. We are going to have another second collection next week for the relief of people affected by disasters in Caribbean Islands, that is: Puerto Rico, Cuba, Virgin Islands and Mexico affected by earthquakes. I ask for your generosity.

As we read the Gospel for this Sunday, we realize that we want to be a people that continue to produce good fruit in our lives, by multiplying the blessings that were given to us by sharing them. I am impressed always by the generosity of those who love life and other people, but I am stoned by the coldness and indifference of those who are selfish and greedy and hateful.

The example of that indifference and hate in its extreme we find in the shooting of innocent people in Las Vegas. It's beyond comprehension, how human beings can arrive to commit such acts of hatred and violence. There is no description for that, there are no words that can express the pain inflicted on victims and families. With sadness's we raise our minds and hearts in prayer before God, we ask for consolation and strength for those affected by those tragedies. We commit ourselves to work for a better world even here in Brentwood, where we have seen senseless violence and death.

Let's continue to reach out to others by enriching our spiritual lives, by enriching our culture, by promoting human values that help us to pursue the happiness, that the Lord promises to be ours in the Beatitudes. Have a great Columbus Day weekend with your family and friends.







We would like to invite everyone in the St. Anne's Community to join us at the 7:00 p.m. Spanish Mass on October 28th as we celebrate the Feast of the Lord of Miracles. The image you see here is an image painted of Jeus Christ that is venerated in Lima, Peru. The image was painted during the 17th century by an unnamed

African taken from what is now Angola to Peru as a slave. Its feast is the main Catholic celebration in Peru and one of the largest processions in the world.


Christ is shown enduring the pain of crucifixion. Above the cross is the Holy Spirit and God the Father. Below and to the right of Jesus is his mother, the Virgin Mary with her heart pierced by a metaphorical sword of sorrow. Kneeling and weeping at the foot of the cross is St. Mary Magdalene.

Every year in October, hundreds of thousands of devotees from all races and economic backgrounds participate in a religious procession honoring the image through the streets of Lima. Boulevards are decorated in purple to celebrate the Lord of Miracles. Please join us for the Mass of Celebration of Señor de los Milagros.




LA LEGION DE MARIA

La vigne du Seigneur, c'est son peuple.

Le poème d'Isaïe pour Lavigne de son ami sonne comme une histoire d'amour, mais il s'inverse soudain en un douloureux réquisitoire. Malgré tous ses soins, la vigne n'a donné que des grappes sauvages. Les raisins qu'elle produit ont le goût amer de l'injustice et de la détresse des pauvres. C'est alors que le prophète révèle le sens profond de sa chanson. Cette vigne est celle du Seigneur et c'est vous, gens de Judas qu'il chérissait. Il en attendait le droit et partout sévissent l'injustice et

le mensonge des juges, la trahison des gouvernants, l'exploitation du petit paysan par les gros propriétaires fonciers. Partout, ce ne sont que des cris de détresse des opprimés de son peuple. La

parabole de Matthieu cite Isaïe pour évoquer, elle aussi, une vigne et son propriétaire. Jésus reproche aux métayers de la parabole d'avoir confisqué le fruit de la vigne à leur profit exclusif.

Qui sont ces vigneron? Ce sont tous les responsables à qui Dieu avait confié son peuple. Ils ont tué et rejeté le Fils. Un autre peuple prendra la relève d'Israël: juifs et païens s'y côtoieront pour

constituer le nouveau peuple de Dieu.
