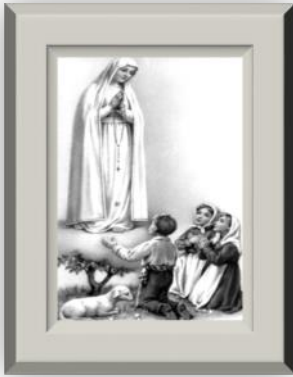

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Sisters and Brothers,



This past Friday October 13th, we had celebrated 100 years of the last apparitions of the Blessed Mother to the children of Fatima. Even though she was talking to children, her messages were for all, inviting everyone to prayer and penance for peace and for the reform of life and so to be prepared for heaven. Blessed Mother wants to help us to be closer to God. It is God's will, that through the devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary many souls would be saved and peace for the world would be obtained.



We all perceive how much our world needs peace and respect of life, how much our world needs God to find meaning in life. Although not all want to admit to that need when they are apparently well, than definitely all seek God when they are in need or in trouble. We who were given the gift of faith we know how consoling and edifying is knowledge and presence of God in our lives. Yet we know our need for daily conversion and reform of our lives. The message of Fatima didn't get old or didn't expire, it is valid until the end of times. The message that wars are the consequences of our sins, is not necessarily seen so easily by us. It is true that the structures of the society are created by our approach to life, by our behavior towards each other, by the laws that we establish to live by, by our relationship to the whole of creation and towards the Creator. The vision of life creates: politics, culture and relationships between people and nations. Personal holiness becomes the salt of the culture and challenges everyone for better, and we had champions of it in selfless people like: Gandhi, Mother Theresa or John Paul II, and of course Jesus is the first. That is for better, but there is as well the list of people that drowned the entire world in the blood of innocent people, and some are more monsters than others: just to mention: Lenin, Hitler and Stalin.

As holiness affects the world, so does the sinfulness. It may appear to be insanity as in the shooter in Las Vegas, but the kind of evil that we witnessed it is insanity of the soul. It was evil that became personified, it is diabolical. With what happened in Las Vegas we know, that evil done by one person may be catastrophic. But any time that we sin, big sin, small sin, it all needs God's mercy and forgiveness, needs healing. Lord, help the families of the victims to deal with their loss, give them strong faith and support of others in their time of need. Lord, give us strong resolve to follow the path of personal holiness and learn to collaborate with the Blessed Mother in her concern for the salvation of everyone.

As we hear Jesus in the Gospel this Sunday, he shows us how much effort God made throughout history to invite people to his table again and again. God wants us to be prepared for the feast that surely comes. It comes for the universe on the end of time, but it comes to each of us individually on the end of our lives. To be prepared, is to be working with the Lord, it is to love God and our neighbor as ourselves. Seems simple and sounds easy in the words of Saint Paul: "I can do all things in him who strengthens me". With God that is ready to forgive always and sacrifices his life in Christ, who rises from the dead to continue to search for commitment from his disciples, how much more can we resist the invitation to the feast. The feast in heaven starts here on earth. It's this same life, since our eternal life started not on the day of our death, but on the day of our birth. It is up to us to embrace it as such, it is our choice to join the feast. Saint Paul got it and he can't stop himself from sharing it with us. Christ's way won him over once and for all. He is ready to give all to Christ, even his very life lost in this life is a gain for eternity.

Lord, increase our faith. Make us worthy of yourself and of your sublime gifts. Give us courage to loose all things for your sake. Lord save us from our ego and selfishness !!! Please, make us your coworkers as you did with the disciples, to go and to proclaim the Gospel to the ends of the earth, starting here in Brentwood, in our own families, in our parish.

Today, on the end of Masses we will make a short time of adoration in place of homily. I encouraged the priests to make a time of meditation in front of Blessed Sacrament that would take a place of homily earlier. After the meditation we would pray the Litany to the Blessed Mother to honor her efforts for the salvation of the world with Jesus by apparitions of Fatima. Then, we will have a blessing with the Blessed Sacrament to end our Mass.

To the People of God of the Diocese of Rockville Centre:

Since my installation in January, I have had the joyful opportunity to visit many of the Diocese's parishes, schools and ministries. Thank you for your commitment to the pursuit of holiness and mission in every dimension of your lives. Thank you for your intimacy with Father, Son and Holy Spirit and your deep desire to share your Catholic faith on Long Island and to be instruments of *dramatic missionary growth*. Your commitment to the Catholic Church's Eucharistic Mission of Mercy to the World has inspired me at every turn.

As your Servant Successor of the Apostles and as your Shepherd, I am now asking all of us together to take a new and important step in the Church's Eucharistic Mission of Mercy by announcing that the Diocese of Rockville Centre will be making a major commitment to the ongoing healing of survivors of acts of child sexual abuse committed by clergy.

As you may have heard, I announced this past week the Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program (IRCP) for the Diocese of Rockville Centre. This program follows years of meaningful and ever vigilant steps taken in this Diocese to protect children and youth. It is a critical and tangible next step towards reconciliation, healing and compensation for survivors of acts of abuse committed by diocesan clergy.

Our Program will be administered by Mr. Kenneth Feinberg, a preeminent mediator in the country who has administered numerous high-profile compensation programs, including the September 11th Victim Compensation Fund and the Compensation Fund for the victims of the BP oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico. Mr. Feinberg will be aided by his colleague, Ms. Camille Biros, in this effort.

The Diocese has also established an Independent Oversight Committee to oversee the implementation and administration of the Program. This committee consists of the Honorable A. Gail Prudenti, Dean of the Maurice A. Deane School of Law at Hofstra University and former Chief Administrative Judge of the Courts of New York State; Michael Cardello III, a partner with the law firm of Moritt Hock & Hamroff; and Dr. Thomas Demaria, a New York State Psychologist who is the Director of the Psychological Services Center of the Doctoral Psychology Program at Long Island University Post.

The Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program builds on the reforms and best practices for protecting our children in the Catholic Church. The outreach of Bishops and survivors' assistance coordinators to survivors and their families, a firm zero tolerance policy and immediate reporting and cooperation with civil authorities, diocesan and parish audits, the ongoing training of clergy, employees and volunteers to prevent child abuse, extensive background checks on employees and volunteers, thorough screening of our seminarians preparing to be priests – these are examples of the proactive procedures which have been integrated into every dimension of the Catholic Church's life and will always require our moment by moment vigilance and commitment.


It is important to note that the funding for this program will come from investment returns over time and insurance programs. Of course, if we were not using these funds for this purpose they could have been used for other dimensions of the Church's mission. However, I am convinced that using these funds to help bring reconciliation, healing and compensation for survivors is a vitally important goal and commitment, and the critical next step in our Church's mission of mercy.

Pope Francis said that survivors of abuse and their families are "true heralds of hope and ministers of mercy". Each one of us in every parish in the Diocese of Rockville Centre and the universal Church is called to pray, to sacrifice and to be instruments of healing for those who have experienced sexual abuse or any form of abuse. In this spirit, we are instruments of the Holy Spirit and the Divine Mercy.

We as a Church recognize that no amount of monetary compensation could ever erase or undo the grave harm suffered by survivors of child abuse. Still, we embrace Christ's healing power and the Mission of Mercy of the Catholic Church as we begin our Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program. We stand in solidarity with our survivors and their families and we continue our commitment and vigilance to the protection of children in our Church and in society. God bless you all and thank you for the inspirational way you live our Church's Mission of Mercy each day.

ALL ARE INVITED

We would like to invite everyone in the St. Anne's Community to join us at the 7:00 p.m. Spanish Mass on October 28th as we celebrate the Feast of the Lord of Miracles. The image you see here is an image painted of Jesus Christ that is venerated in Lima, Peru. The image was painted during the 17th century by an unnamed African taken from what is now Angola to Peru as a slave. Its feast is the main Catholic celebration in Peru and one of the largest processions in the world.

Christ is shown enduring the pain of crucifixion. Above the cross is the Holy Spirit and God the Father. Below and to the right of Jesus is his mother, the Virgin Mary with her heart pierced by a metaphorical sword of sorrow. Kneeling and weeping at the foot of the cross is St. Mary Magdalene.

Every year in October, hundreds of thousands of devotees from all races and economic backgrounds participate in a religious procession honoring the image through the streets of Lima. Boulevards are decorated in purple to celebrate the Lord of Miracles.

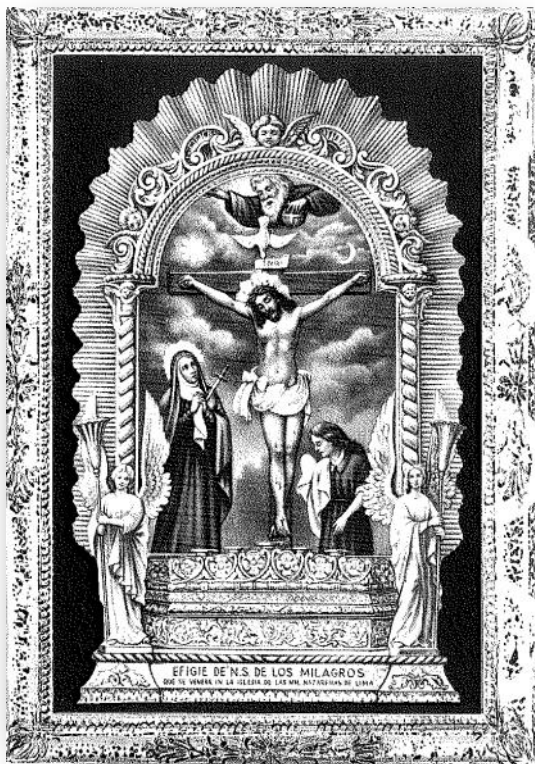

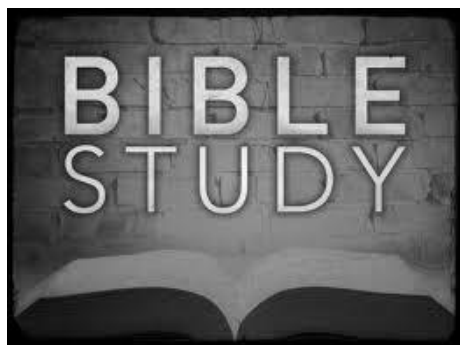

Nous, chrétiens, restons-nous frileusement calfeutres dans nos églises, ou bien ouvrons-nous la porte a ceux du dehors, appelés tout comme nous? Savons-nous accueillir le tout-venant?
