29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Last week we had celebrated with adoration the 100 years of Fatima apparitions of the Blessed Mother. As a community we stood closer by Her who was given to us by Jesus himself at the cross: "Behold your Mother", than "behold your son" and after the disciples took her home. So did we recognize the place of the Blessed Mother in our lives. We need to walk with her through our lives, and it was impressive how calming it was to experience the time of adoration at the end of Mass, with the blessing with the Blessed Sacrament.

The leading theme of last Sunday's readings was the invitation to the feast of Heaven, and that invitation is extended to all peoples at all times, and we want to keep the focus of our lives on that direction in our lives as community, and as individuals. We want to get to heaven to the eternal feast of God's Kingdom.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus clears it for us as well, that we need to be involved in both realities: heavenly and earthly by stating: "repay to Cesar what belongs to Cesar and to God what belongs to God". It is obvious that no one is going to carry us over in this life, and we need to be truly concerned with the way we live our life here on earth, so that we will merit the gift of eternal life in heaven. So the key component of getting to heaven is the way we operate here on earth today. To be concerned with community building according to the principles of the Gospel it is the way to get to heaven. Our involvement in political life is necessary, as a part of setting up of society that is going to facilitate our goals of faith, or is going to be an obstacle on our way. It requires our vigilance to set up just laws, that will permit us to abide by God's Commandments, and we see it clearly, that there are forces that oppose the Commandments and want to force others to break them. It is one thing to respect everyone's free choice, but it is other thing to be left free to decide and to choose what is right, without being pushed into the evil. The liberal forces promote their agenda without respect for the dignity of every human person. Their agenda trumps the dignity and rights of others to life, and to proper family conditions for normal human growth and development. This manipulation of family values and role, will have far going consequences that are going to be hard to correct and comprehend by the persons affected by them.

October, is the month of Right to Life awareness, when in practical ways we show our support for the Life Center, and as parish we will be collecting change into the baby bottles for that purpose. Life, it is a gift partially given by our parents, and mainly by God who gave us soul. We are aware how precious this gift is to us, and we want to give equally same value to life of every other human person. If we want our life to be respected, we need to respect life of others. It is so simple, yet for the purpose of convenience people claim the right to abortion, starting to deny that the persons that are just conceived are fully human yet. As if that conceived human being needed approval or confirmation to become human by other human person. If that conceived human person is left to grow, it grows into the full extent in its proper time. Conceiving abortion as a "right", it pretends to force others to execute that right by assisting in killing innocent lives. It also expands and becomes the economy issue, as if killing children was a profitable business hunting for the victims among distressed women.

The problem is in seeing the possibility of life giving as a great privilege and expression of true love. That dignity of love has to be defended and fostered, and so we will have more happy couples and families and this is what we truly want. This is why we want to have a state, that protects human dignity and life in all stages, from conception to natural death, because only than we can be truly human and happy. Our happiness will never come as a price of someone's life, it can only come from fully supporting equality and dignity of every human person. The state, and the government cannot take that away from us, and can not force us to do differently. Neither government nor individual persons we have the right to decide who lives and who dies. That right to live, is given to us by God at the moment of conception and no one has the right to take it away.

This is why Jesus says: "give to Cesar what belongs to Cesar and to God what belongs to God". God is responsible for giving us life, and the government is responsible for organizing the people into a society that can respect everyone, without infringing on other people's lives, dignity, and faith. God bless everyone !!!!

A las personas de Dios de la Diócesis de Rockville Centre:

Desde mi instalación en enero, he tenido la gran oportunidad de visitar las parroquias, escuelas y ministerios de la diócesis. Gracias por su compromiso en la búsqueda de la santidad y misión en todas las dimensiones de su vida. Gracias por su gran relación con el Padre, el Hijo y el Espíritu Santo, y su profundo deseo de compartir su fe católica en Long Island y ser los agentes del ***Dramático Crecimiento Misionero***. Su compromiso con la Misión Eucarística Misericordiosa de la Iglesia Católica hacia el mundo me ha inspirado a cada paso.

Como su Siervo Sucesor de los Apóstoles y como su Pastor, les pido a todos juntos dar un nuevo e importante paso en la Misión Eucarística Misericordiosa de la Iglesia anunciando que la Diócesis de Rockville Centre adoptará un compromiso significativo en la continua sanación de los sobrevivientes a los actos de abuso sexual de menores cometidos por el clero.

Como ya habrán escuchado, anuncié la semana pasada el Programa Independiente de Reconciliación y Compensación (Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program, IRCP) de la Diócesis de Rockville Centre. Este programa sigue años de significativas medidas y pasos siempre vigilantes en esta diócesis para la protección de los niños y jóvenes. Es el siguiente paso fundamental y concreto hacia la reconciliación, la sanación y la compensación a los sobrevivientes de actos de abuso cometidos por el clero diocesano.

Nuestro programa será administrado por el Sr. Kenneth Feinberg, un prominente mediador en el país que ha administrado numerosos programas de compensación de gran notoriedad, incluyendo el Fondo de Compensación para las Víctimas del 11 de septiembre y el Fondo de Compensación para las Víctimas del derrame de petróleo de BP en el Golfo de México. El Sr. Feinberg será asistido por su colega la Sra. Camille Biros en este esfuerzo.

La Diócesis ha establecido también un Comité Independiente de Supervisión que vigilará la implementación y administración del Programa. Este Comité lo forman la Honorable A. Gail Prudenti, Decano de la Facultad de Derecho Maurice A. Deane de la Universidad de Hofstra y ex Juez Administrativo Principal de los Tribunales del Estado de Nueva York; Michael Cardello III, socio del bufete de abogados Moritt Hock & Hamroff, y el Dr. Thomas Demaria, Psicólogo del Estado de Nueva York director del Centro de Servicios Psicológicos del Programa de Psicología Doctoral en Long Island University Post.

El Programa Independiente de Reconciliación y Compensación se basa en las reformas y mejores prácticas para proteger a nuestros niños en la Iglesia católica. El acercamiento de los Obispos y los coordinadores de ayuda a los sobrevivientes y sus familiares, una firme política de cero tolerancia y el

inmediato reporte y cooperación con las autoridades civiles, las auditorías de la diócesis y las parroquias, la continua capacitación del clero, empleados y voluntarios para prevenir el abuso de menores, la extensa verificación de antecedentes de los empleados y voluntarios, la exhaustiva investigación de nuestros seminaristas que se preparan para el sacerdocio; éstos son ejemplos de los procedimientos proactivos que se han integrado en todas las dimensiones de la vida de la Iglesia Católica y que siempre necesitarán de nuestra vigilancia y compromiso sin descanso.

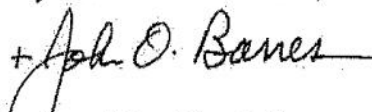
Es importante hacer notar que el financiamiento de este programa provendrá de las ganancias de la inversión a largo plazo y de programas de seguros. Claro está, si no estuviéramos utilizando estos fondos para dicho compromiso, se podrían haber utilizado en otras dimensiones de la misión de la Iglesia. Sin embargo, estoy convencido de que utilizar estos fondos para ayudar a alcanzar la reconciliación, la sanación y la compensación de los sobrevivientes es una meta y un compromiso vitalmente importante y próximo paso fundamental de la misión de misericordia de la Iglesia.

El Papa Francisco dijo que los sobrevivientes del abuso y sus familias son los “verdaderos heraldos de la esperanza y ministros de misericordia”. Cada uno de nosotros en todas las parroquias en la Diócesis de Rockville Centre y en la Iglesia Universal está llamado a orar, sacrificarse y ser agente de la sanación de los que han sufrido abuso sexual o cualquier otra forma de abuso. En este espíritu, somos agente del Espíritu Santo y de la Divina Misericordia.

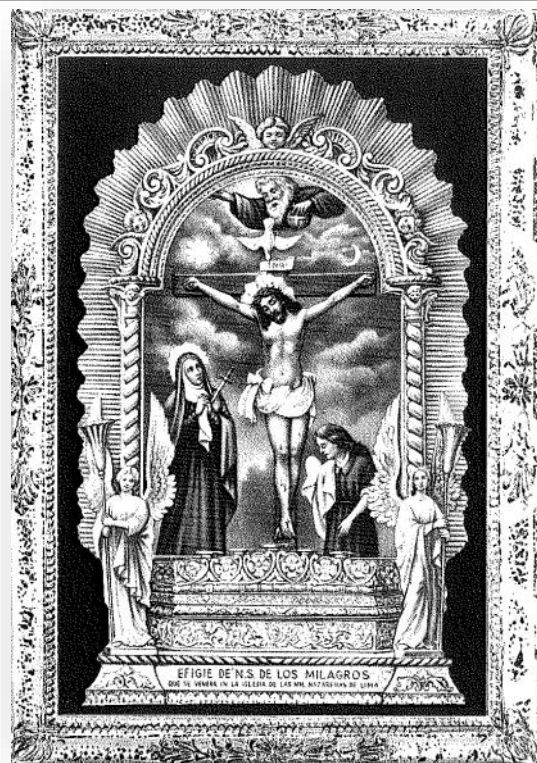

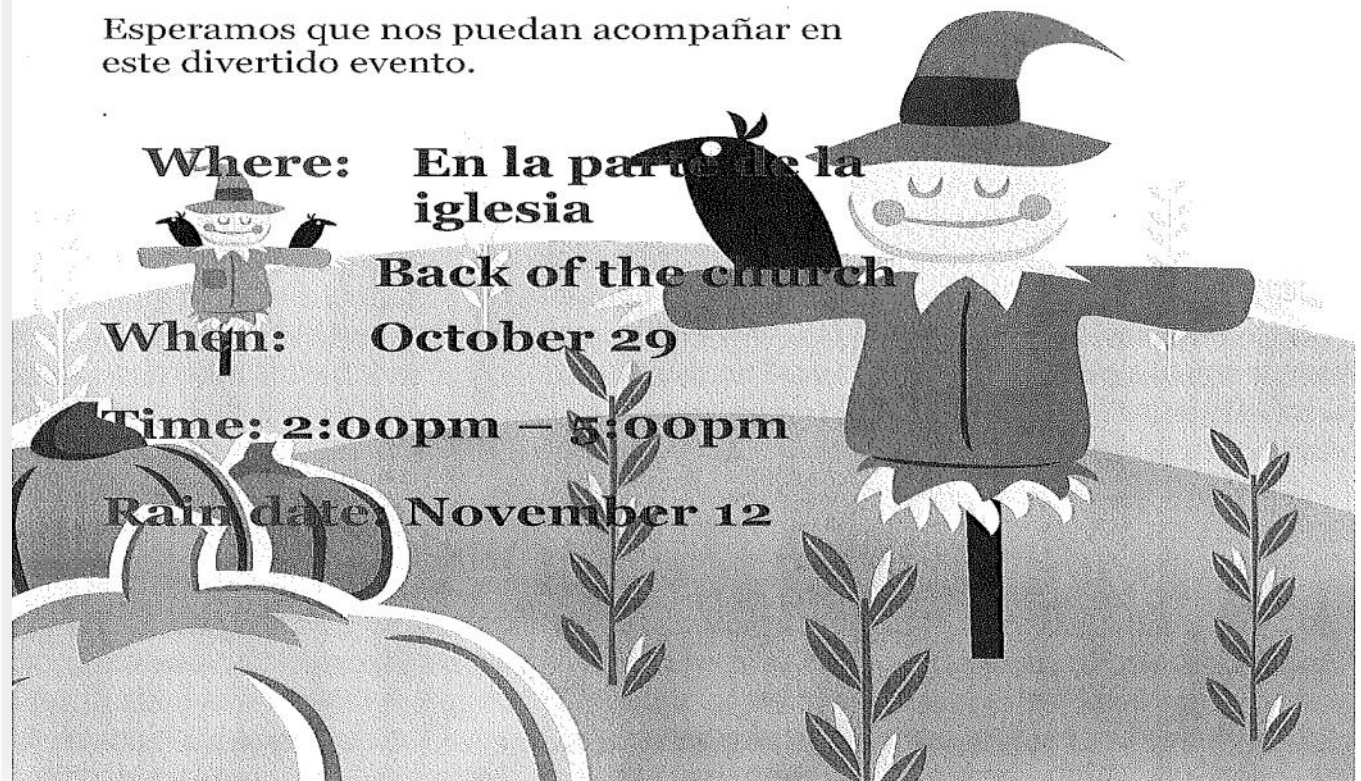

Politique et religion

Le débat entre religion et politique est aussi vieux que le monde. Voici, a plus de cinq siècles d'intervalle, deux éclairages significatifs. Dans la première lecture, un prophète contemporain de l'exil affirme que les chefs politiques peuvent devenir, a leur insu, des instruments providentiels entre les mains de Dieu. Dans l'évangile de Matthieu, Jésus renvoie dos a dos les pharisiens et les hérodiens qui lui demandent s'il est permis, oui ou non, de payer l'impôt a César. La réponse de Jésus, "donnez a César ce qui est a César, et a Dieu ce qui est a Dieu", signifie en réalité: "Cessez de faire de la Palestine une affaire politico-religieuse! Ne rendez de culte qu'a Dieu." Le citoyen pourrait alors verser le tribut a l'empereur sans vendre son âme. Nous n'avons pas a choisir entre politique et religion; nous devons éviter de les mêler. Ainsi la religion n'est pas au service de l'Etat, comme disait l'inscription, ni l'Etat au service de la religion, comme le voulaient les juifs.
