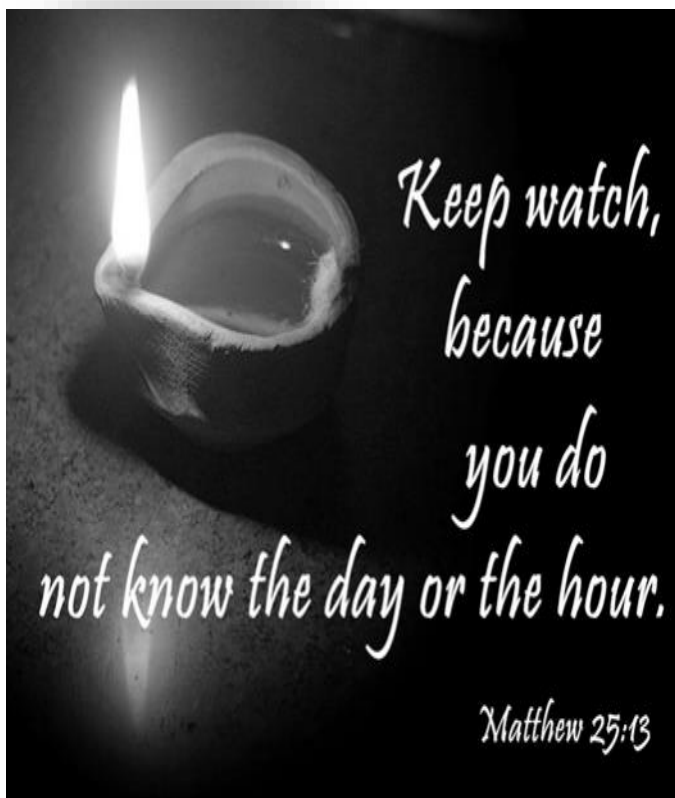

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today's readings speak to us about wisdom. Wisdom is found in all things. All is governed by wisdom of natural laws enclosed in the making of all things. Capacity to decipher the secrets or property of things makes us capable of using it for our advantage. There is a lot of practical wisdom that makes us capable of inventing new things, new ways of doing things. New cures for diseases come with wisdom of biological matters etc. Wisdom encloses all knowledge, and makes use of that knowledge for one's benefit.



There is wisdom of life, that implies our wellbeing and our whole existence. Wisdom is bigger than life itself. Wisdom is above all life. Wisdom can be identified with the source of life. As the Gospel of St John starts: "In the beginning was the Word; the Word was with God and the Word was God." Wisdom it is the essence of everything, it is the meaning and purpose, it is a step on the way to true happiness.

King Solomon, from all things asked for wisdom to govern his people, and that made him a good king, famous and rich. Wisdom, it is the- know how - in approach to important things of life that would bring us happiness. Wisdom it is one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit, that brings us to understanding of our faith and of meaning of life, its purpose and way to find God, as our ultimate goal and happiness. We find wisdom by contemplating, that is by pondering what concerns or fascinates us.

In the Gospel Jesus is teaching us to be vigilant in waiting for the Lord God, who is coming into our lives, and who is there on the end of our earthly life to receive us to his Kingdom of heaven, where there is joy and happiness without ending in the presence of God. The wise thing, is to be waiting prepared for the meeting with God. This is the purpose why Jesus came as He said - "that we may have life and have it abundantly", "so that our happiness might be complete".

In our broken world of violence and manipulation we are lacking wisdom to discern and to promote the common good. In the world of politics and media, we are in the hands of people who will do anything to promote themselves and their agenda. We need to stand in defense of the truth and wisdom, without which the life turns meaningless. We can't stop searching for and serving wisdom because we would lose meaning and purpose of our life. That search is rewarding when we find what we are looking for, and it might be painful as we become aware how far we are from the goal.

Lord save us from our ignorance, save us from being lost. Help us to find the wisdom in our lives and happiness that only You can give.

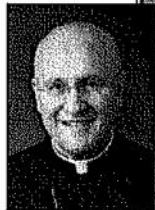

SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION ST. ANNE'S PARISH

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism: For children under 5, please contact the Parish Office (273-8113) for an appointment to speak with a Priest or Deacon at least several weeks before the Baptism. For older children, contact the Office of Family Faith Formation (231-7344).

First Holy Communion: Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

Confirmation: This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of the Sick: Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament is celebrated every Saturday from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Church or by appointment.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Marriage: Congratulations! Couples planning to marry should make an appointment with a Priest or Deacon at least eight (8) months in advance of the wedding to allow time for adequate preparation.

Holy Orders: Is God calling you? Call a Priest or Deacon to discern a possible vocation to the Priesthood, Diaconate or the Religious life.

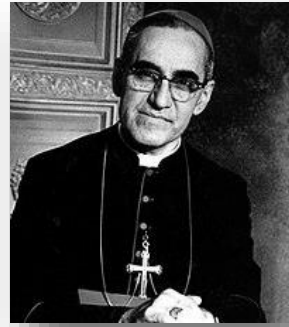

La précaution prise par les jeunes filles avisées signifie que toute leur vie , même lorsqu'elles dorment, est orientée vers l'arrivée de l'époux. Soyons donc prêts a aller au-devant du Christ même quand sa venue est impromptue:" Veillez donc, car vous ne savez ni le jour ni l'heure".
