THE FEAST OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

The end of the liturgical year is here with the arrival of the feast of Christ the King of the Universe. It is a feast in which we anticipate the Second Coming of Christ, when Jesus will come in glory to subject all things to himself. His glorious coming is awaited by the whole Church on earth and in heaven. It will be a time of triumph of good over evil, of life over death. It will be the time when the dead will rise from the graves and those alive will be taken before the throne of God for judgment, and then sent to heaven or hell according to ones merits. The veil of purgatory will be taken away and all souls that were there will see God face to face.



It is all to come, so by this celebration we keep reminding ourselves that our true destiny is heaven and the celebration of eternal life in the kingdom of heaven, where Christ will gather all saved by his blood. If anyone should be confused as to what to do in order to be saved; Jesus gives clear indications and all are accessible to everyone: as he says in the Gospel of today, that: "I was hungry and you gave me to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me to drink," and so on, - because as Jesus says - "whatever you did for the least brothers of mine, you did for me." So in the end it is not so difficult to get to heaven, it's enough to do those simple things and be of service to others and one can be saved. Jesus is not overpowering or scaring us with his power and glory, but he gently invites us to partake in it. Everyone is invited and the doors are open to all, invitations are sent and the party is prepared. How much clearer could it be described ??? In my father's house there are many dwelling places, let your hearts not be troubled. The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified.

That whole process of glorification, of dying and rising to glory is based upon our humble admitting of our need for God, a need to be forgiven, a need to be saved. We need to allow Jesus to be our Lord and Savior. We need to make that simple prayer, inviting Him into our lives and then by following the simple rule, of loving God and our neighbor as ourselves, and we will walk with Jesus into eternal life and glory of heaven. Jesus is scary only to selfish and self centered people, to those who don't see the horizon of salvation, because they are blinded by looking just at themselves, and that should be scary, because without Christ we cannot be saved. We can't save ourselves from our human misery and brokenness, we cannot save ourselves from sin and death. Only Jesus can raise us up on the last day. Only Jesus has that power. Only Jesus saves.

In the second reading St Paul describes the process of the coming of God's Kingdom, when Christ will subject everything to himself, even death, and then: "the Son himself will also be subjected to the one who subjected everything to him, so that God may be all in all. Isn't it fantastic to see all Universe in harmony, to see all nature making sense with its order, to see all politicians silenced by the beauty of God's order and rule ??? Wow - one world order-of true brotherhood and happiness with God's glory shining and permeating all things !!!!

Long live Christ the King !!!

On the human side now, I don't know if you realized we have our own parking lights with the new led technology, that will use incomparably less power than the lights that we had previously. The lights on the outskirts of property we were leasing from PSNEG and we were paying over \$600 monthly for their use. Now it should cost us much less with the new technology. In fact it did cost our parish nothing to put them up as it was \$40,000 given to us in one check by a generous family from outside of our parish. And it is not the first time that they had given to our parish. We want to say a prayer for that family every time we feel enlightened by those great lights. Thank You for being so generous to St. Anne's !!!

God bless everyone and all of you for supporting our parish. I want to thank you all, - especially the widows of our parish- as Jesus said - they give the most because they give from what they need for themselves, and even those pennies that we collect for life center become big money all together. I thank you for contributing to our Catholic Ministries Appeal, that supports all social and spiritual activities of our Diocese and all parishes. Let's be generous with God as God is generous with us. Please continue to support our parish as we continue to maintain, update and better the services that we offer, for the sake of proclamation of the Gospel and bringing Christ light into our lives.

God bless everyone !!! Long live Christ the King of Universe !!!

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism: For children under 5, please contact the Parish Office (273-8113) for an appointment to speak with a Priest or Deacon at least several weeks before the Baptism. For older children, contact the Office of Family Faith Formation (231-7344).

First Holy Communion: Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

Confirmation: This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of the Sick: Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament is celebrated every Saturday from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Church or by appointment.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Marriage: Congratulations! Couples planning to marry should make an appointment with a Priest or Deacon at least eight (8) months in advance of the wedding to allow time for adequate preparation.

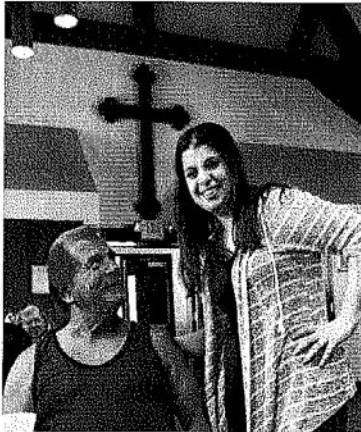

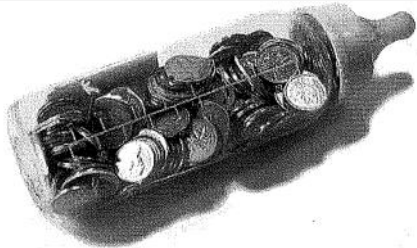

Muchos, por desgracia, jamás te han conocido; muchos, despreciado tus mandamientos, te han desechado Oh Jesús benignísimo!, compadecete de los unos y de los otros, y atraerlos a tu Corazón Santísimo.

Señor, sé Rey, no solo de los hijos fieles que jamás se han alejado de Ti, sino también de los pródigos que te han abandonado; haz que vuelvan pronto a la casa paterna para que no perezcan de hambre y de miseria.

Se Rey de aquellos que, por seducción del error o por espíritu de discordia, viven separados de Ti; devuelvelos al puerto de la verdad y a la unidad de la fe, para que en breve se forme un solo rebaño bajo un solo pastor.

Concede, Oh Señor!, incolumidad y libertad segura a tu Iglesia; otorga a todos los pueblos la tranquilidad en el orden, haz que uno al otro confín de la tierra no resuene sino esta voz: Alabado sea el Corazón divino, causa de nuestra salud! A El entonen cánticos de honor y de gloria por los siglos de los siglos. Amen.

Frecuentemente, hacemos referencia a la Segunda venida de Cristo, hoy la Liturgia trae a cuenta ese momento final de la historia de la humanidad. Con toda la Iglesia digamos: Que viva Cristo Rey!!!
