Dear Sisters and Brothers,

HAPPY EASTER TO ALL !!!!

May the joy of the Risen Christ permeate your life and enlighten it with its light. May the truth of the resurrection bring peace to your mind and trust to your heart, may it bring rest to your tired bodies, may it give you strength of grace to pursue the good of the Gospel, that is, the happiness of eternal life.



Jesus' resurrection is a promise of eternal life to us, it is opening of the gates of heaven for those who believe. That news brings us joy of knowing, that our lives don't end here, that our lives only begin here on earth.

Our Easter joy does not come from the Easter bunny, Easter eggs, Easter lamb; it comes from the empty tomb. This is what the Easter bunny expresses in children's language, saying that: as the bunny comes out of the hole in the ground to see the light of the world and to enjoy life, so Christ comes out of the grave to enjoy his eternal life with us.

Significance of Easter eggs comes from the empty tomb as well. As the little chicken comes out of the egg leaving the empty egg shell behind, so Christ left the empty tomb behind. It is not childish at all, it is very true and hopefully we appreciate the origin of that symbolism with its power to enlighten our life, but specially our death.

Easter lamb is another analogy for the Resurrection, as it is the Paschal lamb, who was sacrificed for the Passover meal and marking of the entrances of the Jewish houses with its blood for protection against the Angel of death; and now he is back alive standing triumphant with the white flag signifying the white burial cloth carried in victorious way.

The Easter joy is coming from Christ being victorious over death, opening for us the new realm of life after death in the glory of heaven. So being in the process of our first life, we rejoice in the fact that Christ gives us the gift of second life after death - life that will never end in the glory of heaven. That certainty of eternity empowers the joy of Easter to well up in the hearts of believers. It anticipates our own resurrection through the grace of Christ's resurrection. It makes us victorious together with Christ over all the losses that we suffered in this life. It gives new meaning to all experiences of life, it makes them eternal since they will always exist in our hearts, they become the part of eternity with us, because in God - love never ends. In God and in God's kingdom life is eternal and love is eternal, and this is the revelation of the resurrection.

So the Easter joy brightens the dark moments of this life, gives them new meaning and significance, it redeems them. The worst moments of this life become livable, because of the resurrection, that makes them part of our redemption process, and that is Christ's gift to us. So Jesus' resurrection changes all pain and suffering and even death itself into the project of redemption and salvation, for the one that undergoes them, and for those for whom he offers them. Resurrection totally changes the perspective on life. This life becomes only a beginning of eternal life, it becomes an introduction into Christ and his kingdom. Resurrection gives new meaning to everything that happens to us in this life, and that is the Easter joy, and so really it is possessed by those who believe, by those who entrust their lives to Christ. And we entrust our lives to Christ by living our lives according to the Gospel, that Jesus left us to follow. Doing that we draw from the treasury of resurrection, from the treasury of god's promises and god's glory.

HAPPY EASTER !!!!

The Power of the Risen Christ and Dramatic Missionary Growth
in the Church of Rockville Centre

Dear Friends:

As we celebrate Easter with our families and our parish families, we ask the Risen Lord for a true resurrection of our belief that *dramatic missionary growth* of the Catholic Church in the Diocese of Rockville Centre can and will happen.

The courageous Cardinal Van Thuan, who witnessed powerfully to his Catholic faith while locked for years in a Vietnam prison, described the logic of Christ's resurrection in our lives in this way: "Jesus cast fire on the earth and He desires the earth to be set ablaze with its brilliant light. You must be the bright flame kindled by apostolic zeal; from your bright light other torches must be kindled until the whole world is a vast sea of living flame".

Together, let's each one of us be instruments of the Risen Lord who start that "vast sea of living flame" here in the Church of Rockville Centre, a vast sea of living flame that spreads throughout the Church in the Northeast, around the country to the whole world.

Consider Katie, a Senior at an Oyster Bay area public high school. She was recently accepted to Notre Dame University in South Bend and will most likely major in Finance. Notre Dame connects incoming students by Social Media so that they can interact and get to know each other a bit before they ever set foot on campus. Through a series of online conversations, Katie eloquently witnessed in a natural way to the cosmic power of the Catholic Mass streaming through every dimension of her life and was able to convince in a gentle and effective way an incoming freshman from Wyoming to come back to Mass.

When Katie told me this story, I was so deeply moved that this winning and charismatic young woman had heard Pope Francis' call to be a missionary disciple and was setting an example for both her peers and every generation of Catholics of how to reach out in faith and in the spirit of the Divine Mercy to others. She was also living the power of Christ's resurrection by being the instrument of spiritual resurrection in a young man's life. I can imagine Katie and her classmate from Wyoming saying a prayer and lighting a candle together -- being part of the "vast sea of living flame" at Notre Dame's mystic Grotto at the center of campus sometime in August when they both arrive on campus.


The story of Katie and her Notre Dame classmate is a moving and inspiring challenge to each one of us to ask people to come home to their Catholic faith and to invite others to consider the Splendor of Truth and Mercy of our Catholic faith.

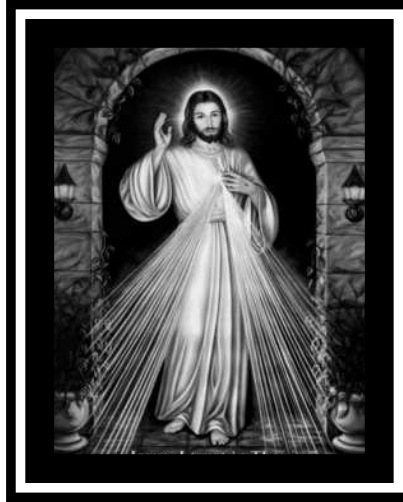
This Easter, you and I rediscover the power of Christ's Resurrection in a new and fresh way. A renewed love and confidence in the power of the Risen Christ refreshes and strengthens our marriages, our family relationships and every friendship we experience in the course of our lives. A rediscovery of the power of Christ's resurrection helps our families become part of the "vast sea of living flame" that transforms the world and history.

This Easter 2017 we pray together that the light of the Divine Mercy that streams from the glorified wounds of the Risen Lord may touch the wounds of our families and the wounds of poor families, immigrant and refugee families separated by long distances and upheaval, families living in the midst of war, oppression and persecution, and families struggling with drug abuse and the opioid crisis.

Know that as your Shepherd and a Successor of the Apostles what an honor it is to be the servant of each one of your families as together we embrace the Holy Spirit's call to *dramatic missionary growth* in the Church of Rockville Centre.

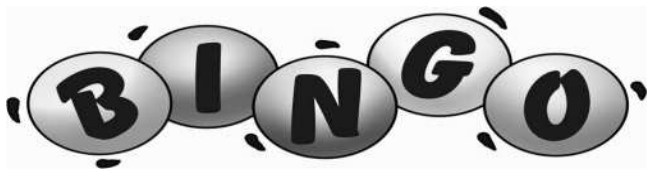

PASCUA DE 2017



El Poder del Cristo Resucitado y el Dramático Crecimiento Misionero

en la Iglesia de Rockville Centre

Queridos amigos:

Al celebrar la Pascua con nuestras familias y las familias parroquiales, pedimos al Señor Resucitado una verdadera resurrección de nuestra fe de que el *dramático crecimiento misionero* de la Iglesia Católica en la Diócesis de Rockville Center puede y va a suceder.

El valiente Cardenal Van Thuan, quien testimonió poderosamente su fe católica mientras estuvo encarcelado durante años en una prisión de Vietnam, describió la lógica de la resurrección de Cristo en nuestras vidas de esta manera: "Jesús echó fuego sobre la tierra y desea que se la tierra arda con su brillante luz. Tú debes ser la llama brillante encendida por el celo apostólico; de tu luz brillante otras antorchas podrán encenderse hasta que el mundo entero sea un inmenso mar de llamas vivas."

Juntos, cada uno seamos instrumentos del Señor Resucitado que comienza ese "vasto mar de llamas vivas" aquí en la Iglesia de Rockville Centre, un vasto mar de llamas vivas que se extiende por toda la Iglesia en el Nordeste y por el mundo entero.

Consideremos a Katie, una estudiante del último año en una escuela secundaria pública de Oyster Bay. Recientemente fue aceptada en la Universidad de Notre Dame en South Bend y probablemente se especializará en Finanzas. Notre Dame conecta a los estudiantes entrantes a través de "Red Social" para que puedan interactuar y conocerse un poco antes de haber puesto un pie en la universidad. A través de una serie de conversaciones en línea, Katie elocuentemente dio testimonio, de manera natural, del inmenso poder que la Misa Católica hace fluir en todas dimensiones de su vida, y así fue capaz de convencer de manera suave y eficaz a un recién llegado de Wyoming para volver a la Misa.

Cuando Katie me contó esta historia, me conmovió profundamente que esta jovencita íntegra y carismática hubiera escuchado el llamado del Papa Francisco a ser discípulo misionero y diera un ejemplo para sus compañeros y para cada generación de católicos de cómo alcanzar en fe y en el espíritu de la Divina Misericordia a los demás. Ella también estaba viviendo el poder de la resurrección de Cristo al ser el instrumento de la resurrección espiritual en la vida de un joven. 

*Le pouvoir du Christ Ressuscité et la croissance spectaculaire de la mission
Dans l'église de Rockville Centre*



Chers amis:

Comme nous célébrons Pâques avec nos familles et nos familles paroissiales, nous demandons au Seigneur Ressuscité pour une vraie résurrection de notre croyance que *la croissance spectaculaire de la mission* de l'Église Catholique dans le diocèse de Rockville Centre puisse atteindre son but.

Le courageux Cardinal Van Thuan, qui fut un témoin puissant de sa foi Catholique durant ses années en prison au Vietnam, décrivit la logique de la résurrection du Christ dans nos vies de la sorte: «Jésus a allumé le feu sur la terre et il veut que la terre soit embrasée par sa lumière éclatante. Vous devez être la flamme brillante, allumée par le zèle apostolique; De votre flamme lumineuse d'autres torches doivent être allumées jusqu'à ce que le monde entier soit une vaste mer de flamme vivante ».

Ensemble, soyons tout un chacun des instruments du Seigneur Ressuscité qui proclame cette «vaste mer de flammes vivantes» ici dans l'Église de Rockville Centre, une vaste mer de flammes vivantes qui s'étend dans toute l'Église du Nord-est, à travers le pays et dans le monde entier.

L'histoire de Katie et son camarade de classe de Notre Dame est un défi émouvant et inspirant pour tout un chacun d'entre nous de demander aux gens de revenir à leur foi catholique et inviter d'autres personnes à considérer la splendeur de la vérité et de la miséricorde de notre foi catholique.

Cette Pâque, vous et moi redécouvrons le pouvoir de la Résurrection du Christ d'une manière nouvelle et fraîche. Un amour renouvelé et une croyance dans la puissance du Christ Ressuscité qui renouvelle et fortifie nos mariages, nos relations familiales et toute amitié que nous expérimentons au cours de nos vies. Une redécouverte du pouvoir de la Résurrection du Christ aide nos familles à faire partie de la «vaste mer de la flamme vivante» qui transforme le monde et l'histoire.

En cette Pâques de 2017, nous prions ensemble pour que la lumière de la Divine Miséricorde qui déverse des plaies glorifiées du Seigneur Ressuscité puisse cicatriser les plaies de nos familles et les blessures des familles pauvres, des familles d'immigrants et de réfugiés séparés par de longues distances et des bouleversements, au milieu de la guerre, de l'oppression et de la persécution, des familles qui luttent contre l'abus et la crise des drogues.

Sachez qu'en qualité de votre Berger et un successeur des Apôtres qu'il m'est l'honneur d'être le serviteur de chacune de vos familles et qu'ensemble nous embrassons l'appel du Saint-Esprit à la croissance spectaculaire de la mission dans l'église de Rockville Centre.
