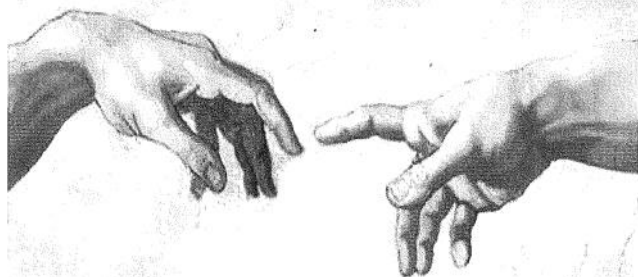

From your Pastor:



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

As I am writing this article it is still before the 5th Sunday of Lent, as we had to submit the bulletin to the printer earlier because of their deadlines with upcoming holidays .



The Holy Week approaches fast and it starts with Palm Sunday. On Monday, April 10th we will have a Parish Confessions Day from 3:00 pm to 9:00 pm for all who want to be better prepared for the reception of Holy Communion this Easter. "If you say you have no sin you are a liar" -

St. John tells us . We all have sins - the matter is only how big they are. The big sins we call - mortal sins- that will take us down to Hell. When we break the 10 Commandments- these are big sins- mortal sins - deadly sins. The other- small sins not necessarily require confessional confession. They are forgiven with an act of contrition every time we sincerely ask God's mercy. We always do it at the beginning of Mass. Each Mass starts with the act of contrition - so as we make it let us try to be truly contrite - truly sorry so we will be forgiven. If you are unsure how grave are your sins- ask the priest in the confessional and he will help you to assess your sins. I ask Marge in our office to find a good version of a preparation for the examination of conscience and print it in this bulletin, a little reflection on 10 Commandments.

After a good Confession - unless you have no sins - I invite all to participate in the Liturgies of the Holy Week. Holy Thursday 7:30 pm Mass of The Lords Supper- with the washing of the feet. Good Friday Living Way of the Cross at 2:00 pm and Veneration of the Cross at 3:00 pm. Than Easter Vigil Mass at 7:30 pm with blessing of the fire and Baptism and Confirmation for Adults who will receive the Sacraments of Christian Initiation. Than Easter Sunday- Sunday of the Resurrection. As the Bible says -if we die with Christ, we shall also rise with Him. Let's walk with Christ through the celebration of this Holy Week by active participation that starts today, as we pick up the palms to manifest our solidarity with Christ, to manifest our faith in Him. All palms will be blessed before they are distributed, so that as we bless them in each Mass, you remember the blessing goes as well to the persons who carry them.

Palm Sunday it is particular Sunday as we enact the glorious entrance of Jesus to Jerusalem before the Passover. At the Mass we read the whole Passion of Jesus of what that entrance of Jesus led to 2000 years ago, and we participate in it today by joining the crowd with the Palm in our hand to manifest our faith in Jesus. We want to walk in life with Him, since we want to be with Him at the Resurrection, to walk with Him again in Heaven.

Who are you going to be ? Choose one of the participants of that entrance to Jerusalem and try to identify with their role in the Passion of Jesus. Who would you be? Just one hiding in the crowd, not wanting to be involved, just passive -see what's happen person, or someone particular who wants to be close to Jesus? Take a risk and get close to Jesus, decide to be his friend, his apostle, his helper like the Simon of Cyrene carrying the cross with Jesus. Who would you want to be? Who is Jesus is to you or whom you want to be to Him ? Decide for yourself and pursue it in your relationship with Jesus; are you His friend, His enemy or indifferent person that is waiting for all to happen by itself. That crowd that gathered around Jesus is real, and our participation in it is real, as

Jesus continues to walk with us through life and gives us opportunity to make our relationship with him into what we desire, into what we are capable of giving and receiving from Him. Jesus corresponds to us, his love is infinite, his friendship total, his dedication wholehearted. Let's step up to the call, that Jesus presents to us with his person, and He will transform us into "The best version of ourselves ", into a Saint. Have a good Holy Week !!!!

A Brief Examination of Conscience

Based on the Ten Commandments

I am the LORD your God: you shall not have strange Gods before me.

Have I treated people, events, or things as more important than God?

You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain.

Have my words, actively or passively, put down God, the Church, or people?

Remember to keep holy the LORD's Day.

Do I go to Mass every Sunday (or Saturday Vigil) and on Holy Days of Obligation (Jan. 1; the Ascension; Aug. 15; Nov. 1; Dec. 8; Dec. 25)? Do I avoid, when possible, work that impedes worship to God, joy for the Lord's Day, and proper relaxation of mind and body? Do I look for ways to spend time with family or in service on Sunday?

Honor your father and your mother.

Do I show my parents due respect? Do I seek to maintain good communication with my parents where possible? Do I criticize them for lacking skills I think they should have?

You shall not kill.

Have I harmed another through physical, verbal, or emotional means, including gossip or manipulation of any kind?

You shall not commit adultery.

Have I respected the physical and sexual dignity of others and of myself?

You shall not steal.

Have I taken or wasted time or resources that belonged to another?

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

Have I gossiped, told lies, or embellished stories at the expense of another?

You shall not covet your neighbor's spouse.

Have I honored my spouse with my full affection and exclusive love?

You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

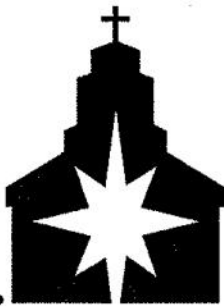
Am I content with my own means and needs, or do I compare myself to others unnecessarily?

Christ's Two Commandments

How well do we love God and others? Do we love as Christ calls us to? In the Gospel of Matthew, Christ gives us Two Commandments: "He said to him, 'You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments'" (Mt 22:37-40).

Not sure what love is? St. Paul describes it for us in his Letter to the Corinthians. Is this how you love God and others? "Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous, [love] is not pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails" (1 Cor 13:4-8).

UNO DE LOS MOMENTOS Y UNO DE LOS DIAS

Una vez interrumpido todo lo 25, desde el 26 de febrero hasta el 27 de febrero hasta el 28 de febrero. Es una semana que tiene un comienzo y un final y comienza en perdurar a mitad del camino y se vive cada día a cada celebración como un momento "autónomo", separado de los demás.

Comenzar la semana con la fiesta de Domingo de Ramos, una semana de la Pasión de Resurrección. Es Domingo de Ramos. Recordar las palabras del Evangelio Mt. 21, 33-43: "La gente se aglutina en torno a Jesús para escucharle porque se habían enterado que había enseñado la sabiduría y la fuerza". Cada día de la semana de la Pasión y por eso se celebran los pasajes de Dios a la vida.

Buscar con atención y, si es posible, ser uno de los actores de la Pasión, tanto el 25 de febrero como el 26 de febrero, y participar como "espectador activo". El relato bíblico de los últimos días de Jesús comienza todo el 25 de febrero, de la Pasión, de la Pasión y de la Resurrección. Agradecer a los Pastores de la Iglesia (pastores y diáconos) por su servicio y presencia.

Comenzar. Que no sea imprescindible lo que sucede en cada día de la Pasión de la Pasión, tanto y también sobre ella.

Hacer algún tipo de vida durante del "momento" en la casa del Señor. Hablar con Él. En un momento de relativa compañía e intimidad, desde la preocupación, el sufrimiento de la vida, el

amor... puede tener un papel especial en la conversación.

En estos días, en momentos con alguna política religiosa que sea capaz de pasar en una familia siendo y viviendo la Pasión del Señor también a través del día.

Buscar en algún momento y contemplar cada momento con ojos nuevos. Buscar a la vida cada momento, cada día, cada momento de esa semana...

Comenzar el relato de Dios a la Pasión de la Pasión, con un gesto de agradecimiento. Buscar en silencio también hoy. Contemplar su muerte también hoy.

Comenzar la Cruz con una carga importante de significación. Poner gestos desde un día con una carga simbólica como el relato a la Pasión de la Pasión (Dios a la Pasión)... ¿cómo hacerlo?

Buscar un relato de la Pasión con el Señor y el Señor. Buscar y pensar que cada día sea todo los tiempos del mundo. Dios está.

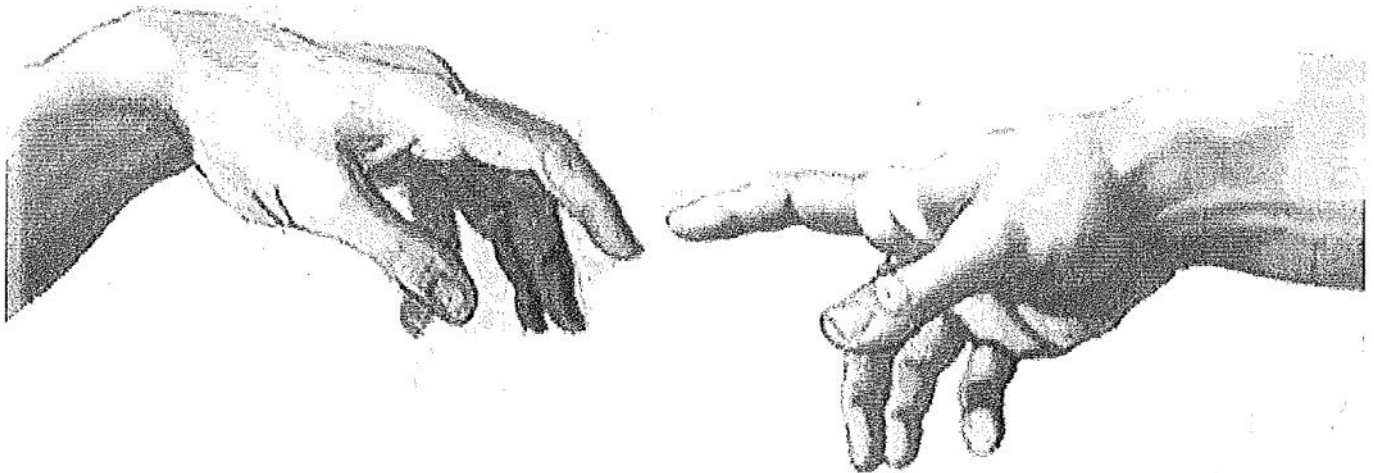
