Dear Sisters and Brothers,



This coming week we have already arrived at the beginning of Lent, with Ash Wednesday to get us initiated into the season. So I ask you to take home a bulletin, so that you may find out what is the time for services, and let others know if they ask. It is interesting, that Ash Wednesday falls on the feast of St Valentine's. Surely it doesn't interfere with personal expressions of friendship and love to those that God gave us, but it would be awkward to have a party on that day.

In anticipation of Lent, different cultures have a party celebrations before Ash Wednesday, since no parties were done during the Lenten season. We have Mardi Gras parade and parties. It is called Fat Tuesday. In other cultures they party on Thursday before Ash Wednesday, calling it Fat Thursday. Some go to exaggerated ways of partying, as we see in Brazilian carnival that goes on for couple of weeks. On cultural level it often will go to exaggeration, but who wants to celebrate or party in moderation, it is always possible. Historically, after Ash Wednesday there were no parties until Easter, so no wonder people wanted to make a big party before the Lent, than attend the Ash Wednesday with the purpose of conversion and penance for the sake of Easter preparation. That is the origin of Mardi Gras and all pre Lent parties.

So to combine culture and life we celebrate life, family, friendship, community, to enjoy life and to give thanks and praise to God for all good things of life. We make St Valentine's party this weekend before Ash Wednesday, to get appreciative of the blessings of friendship, love and life; and than we will be ready to take on the penitential spirit of Lent and conversion.

As St Paul tells us in the Second Reading: - *whatever you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do everything for the glory of God. Avoid giving offense..... Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ*-.

All that we do, depends on our attitude that we have. If we want to be respectful and honorable, we can make always good choices of kindness and love for God and for others. We need only to preserve the healthy limits to all that we do. This principle applies to all times and situations. The moderation should never leave us in all things of life, and that would make us happy. Keeping first things first, helps us to make right choices in life, and keeping healthy balance, so that we could use all things for our good.

Easter will be reminding us that our Supreme Good is God Himself, and the goal of our lives is to reach heaven. That is the whole purpose of our life, so Lent it is a time of preparation for that goal. God made all things for our benefit and enjoyment, but as we learned from the Bible, it was by the envy of the Devil, that sin entered the world. So now we are subject to evil and death, and we have to struggle with suffering and pain. So our choices in life, it is our attempt to reach that happiness of heaven again in this life and than in the next.

When we read about the leprosy and the treatment of the person sick with it, we can only imagine the hardship of persons affected by it. They would be automatically outcast from the community. The lepers would live in -ghetto-, in -human slums-, in waist dumping places, as Pope Francis would say: "*on the outskirts of society, on the periphery of society.*"

If it was so then, so it would be somewhat similar for the persons affected by infectious disease today. It would cause hardship and separation from people. Even today, terminal sickness imposes great limits and suffering upon the person affected and the whole family. And those terms of being outcast are very much remembered by Pope Francis, who identifies those realities in the society of today, as the society that quickly throws away what is not useful to it, or what becomes outdated, not fashionable, old.

Thinking of it we realize, that we have much to be redeemed in our society of today. The human treatment of other human beings is far from being human in many places and situations. Every person is equal before God, and we need to learn and practice that truth in daily life. We want to know our own dignity before God, and we want to see that dignity in every person. How much we need Jesus today to help us to be cleansed of the leprosy of sin, of indifference, of judgement ??? How much we need Jesus to cure our diseases afflicting humanity in our times??? We all could mention dozens of infirmities, that we would want Jesus to wipe out of the face of the earth. But would it make us a better people ??? Would it make us more humble and brother like to each other ??? Would it advance our salvation ??? Or would it let us go further in our egocentricity, would it make us selfish in new ways, more proud of our own achievements ??? Lord, if you wish, you can make us clean. We need it and we pray for it.

God bless everyone !!!


OUTREACH

And most recently, he has authored his first book, titled *Hurting in the Church: A Way Forward for Wounded Catholics*.



ATTENTION - ATENCION

Due to severe flu outbreaks at this time in our diocese, priests, deacons, and Eucharistic ministers are reminded of the need to practice good hygiene prior to and after the distribution of Holy Communion. This involves cleansing one's hands before Mass and when visiting people in their homes or in institutions, such as hospitals and nursing homes. It is also recommended that this be done prior to and after the celebration of other sacraments and religious and parish functions. This may be done by washing with hot water and soap or by means of an alcohol-based antibacterial hand sanitizer. Concelebrants who have the flu should exercise the option of intinction when receiving Holy Communion. Eucharistic ministers should not serve when they are sick. Due to this particularly bad flu season pastors have the option of offering Holy Communion only under one species, until health conditions improve. Priests and parishioners may also opt not to shake hands at the sign of peace, but express peace through another gesture or verbal greeting. Notices on any changes should be made to the people of the parishes in bulletins and/or verbal announcements at Mass.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism: For children under 5, please contact the Parish Office (273-8113) for an appointment to speak with a Priest or Deacon at least several weeks before the Baptism. For older children, contact the Office of Family Faith Formation (231-7344).

First Holy Communion: Children usually begin Religious Education studies in the First Grade and are prepared for Communion in the Second Grade. Call the Family Faith Formation Office (231-7344) to register your child the summer before the school year begins.

Confirmation: This Sacrament is currently celebrated in the Eighth Grade after 2 years of preparation. Please call the Religious Education Office (231-7344) for more information.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of the Sick: Call the Parish Office at any time to arrange for the Anointing of the Sick either at home or in the hospital.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament is celebrated every Saturday from 4:00 - 4:45 PM in the Church or by appointment.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Marriage: Congratulations! Couples planning to marry should make an appointment with a Priest or Deacon at least eight (8) months in advance of the wedding to allow time for adequate preparation.

Holy Orders: Is God calling you? Call a Priest or Deacon to discern a possible vocation to the Priesthood, Diaconate or the Religious life.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament: Each Thursday from 12:30 PM until 5:15 PM. First Friday from 5:30 PM until 7:00 PM. Rosary after the 12:00 daily Mass.

Miraculous Medal Novena: Monday after the 12:00 Mass and First Saturday from 8:15 - 9:00 AM.

The clock is ticking!

There is only one month left until March 5 and the official end of DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals). But the deadline for 122 young people is today, and every day until March 5 because they lose their status as long as a permanent solution languishes without congressional action.

Congress must act to pass a pathway to citizenship for DACA recipients – one that is as close to the Dream Act as possible – without a high price for families.

In the House there are two options:

- 1) The USA Act, a bi-partisan bill that would provide a path to citizenship for 1.8 million Dreamers with modest border security provisions that were crafted in consultation with border communities and the Congressional Hispanic Caucus. The USA Act incorporates the important pieces of the Dream Act and is truly a legislative solution that would pass if it is brought to a vote.
- 2) Another bill – “The Securing America’s Future Act” – has the potential to be disastrous. It does not offer a path to citizenship, puts money into border militarization, and guts family reunification programs in an attempt to overhaul the entire immigration system.

As the DACA deadline approaches, anti-immigrant supporter in Congress are counting on their Democratic colleagues to act in desperation on anything.

Supporters of immigrant families need to keep up the pressure to oppose “Securing America’s Future Act” and support the bi-partisan USA Act. Call your representative at

Under terrible conditions they work in factories, plow fields, harvest crops, work quarries, fill brothels, clean homes and haul water. Many are children with tiny fingers for weaving rugs and small shoulders for bearing rifles. Their labor is forced, their bodies beaten, their faces hidden from those who don't really want to see them. But you see them all, God of the poor. You hear their cry and you answer by opening our eyes, and breaking our hearts, and loosening our tongues to insist: No more. Amen.

La loi de Moïse, rappelle par la première lecture, n'était pas seule à traiter les lépreux en parias. Notre société a tendance à marginaliser bien des gens: le chômeur de longue durée, le malade atteint de sida, le délinquant, l'immigre.

'Devant toi, Jésus, je suis ce lépreux pour qui tu as le cœur remué de tendresse, que tu veux toucher dans le sacrement de réconciliation, réintégrer dans la communion de l'Eglise et envoyer, renouvelé, porter témoignage à ses frères.
