

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

This week we celebrated two great saints: Saint Joseph, and Saint Patrick. It is amazing how the Saints inscribe themselves into the history of the Church, by showing us the ever shining example of their faith and life reflecting it. The centuries go by, but the example of the



saints stands ever more evident and stronger, as the passing times affirms their faith,

hope and love to be much appreciated monument of the time and life passed, yet their example is always alive in the hearts of the believers. They become the next stone in the edifice of the Church, standing on the foundations of the Apostles. This is how Jesus manifests himself in the lives of his believers, by making them a sign on the way to himself and ultimately to God.

The path of Lent is very indicative, starting with Ash Wednesday awareness, that we came from earth's ashes and to them we will turn.

Than, we have seen Jesus tempted in the desert. On 2nd Sunday of Lent, the Gospel spoke of Transfiguration of Jesus. On 3rd Sunday of Lent, Jesus engages in dialogue with Samaritan Woman and community, revealing himself to them. This Sunday Jesus reaches out to the blind man, and we hear how much confusion was created by those who commented on the cure. The blind man comes to the faith in Jesus as Messiah, but the spiritual blindness of many comes to evidence in their resentment directed towards Jesus or the man that was cured and his family.

This kind of resentment and negative commentaries, we could experience ourselves in those days, as the world deals with the corona virus. Too much political commentary having nothing to do with carrying for sick or for curing the virus, just fueling the sense of helplessness and disappointment.

This situation with this virus makes us vulnerable and needy of the Lord. It should make us humble and cooperative in helping each other to contain the spread of it. In the world and culture that negates the need for God and for faith, the existence of unknown is very threatening, but for us who have faith, it only proves our dependence and need for God. As Jesus showed us, he always cares for the sick and the vulnerable, blind and lepers. Jesus very much cares for everyone, to the point of taking on, all those difficult steps: of desert, challenge by unbelievers, submission to haters who ultimately killed him. Jesus never abandons us, but walks with us even to the point of death and resurrection, in order to bring us the Transfiguration of heaven. This is the purpose of Lent, to prepare us for heaven, so let us engage with Jesus in this journey of faith, starting with prayer, penance, fasting and alms giving.

Let's read again this Sunday's Gospel and see how involved Jesus gets in the life of the blind man, and let us invite him to take away our blindness, our brokenness, our sinfulness.

See for yourself the new confessionals with extra privacy for the penitent, with a possibility for conversation on penitents request. Realize we have confessions daily at 5pm. If you are without sin, you are a Saint. If you are a sinner, come and leave your sins behind and be free and happy believer ready for Easter.

This coming Wednesday we will celebrate the feast of the Annunciation of the Lord. The Masses will follow the Solemnity daily calendar with Spanish Mass at 7:30 instead of prayer group, ending with Adoration.



El tiempo de Cuaresma (IV)

Además del itinerario de los evangelios, los domingos de Cuaresma nos ofrecen también otro itinerario de reflexión. Es el itinerario de las primeras lecturas. Son, durante la Cuaresma, un repaso de los grandes momentos de la historia de la salvación, la historia que nos conduce hacia el momento culminante de Jesús y su Pascua. Cada año leemos escenas diferentes, comenzando por el inicio de la historia humana, pasando por Abrahán, deteniéndonos en la historia del pueblo de Israel, mirando el futuro a través de los anuncios proféticos que nos hablan de la nueva alianza que Dios hace con la humanidad, y acabando, el domingo de Ramos, con la figura del siervo de Yahvé, la imagen más clara que tenemos en el Antiguo Testamento de la entrega de Jesús para darnos vida. Es un itinerario que nos ayuda a descubrir cual es el estilo de Dios que acompaña la historia humana, y ayuda, a la vez, a vivir este tiempo como un camino hacia la plenitud.

Es importante hacerse un "programa personal" para vivir la Cuaresma. Quizá el mejor programa sería parar a preguntarse si pensamos como Jesús pensaba, si tenemos sus mismos criterios ante las cosas, si intentamos vivir como el vivía. Podríamos decirlo así: si tenemos la misma ideología de Jesús. Convertirse es esto: cambiar de manera de pensar, cambiar de dirección, y adoptar la misma manera de pensar, ponerse en la misma dirección, y adoptar la misma manera de pensar, ponerse en la misma dirección, que Jesús. Si leemos el evangelio honestamente, seguro que encontraremos muchas preguntas para hacernos, muchas cosas para meditar. Y como consecuencia, muchas formas de actuar que debemos afianzar y mejorar, y muchas otras que debemos, al contrario, cambiar.

La parabole du -pharisien et du collecteur d'impôts (Luc 18,9-14)

La parabole que voici est adressée a certains qui étaient persuadés d'êtres eux-mêmes des justes. L'attitude décrite ici est un travers qui se retrouve chez des croyants de la communauté chrétienne. Le lecteur est invite à 'voir dans l'attitude du publicain un exemple proposé à l'imitation et dans celle du pharisien un contre-exemple (J. Scholsser).

Deux personnages, deux prières qui révèlent l'attitude profonde de l'un et de l'autre. Pourquoi Dieu approuve-t-il ce collecteur d'impôts, qui appartient à la catégorie des pécheurs par excellence (5,27)? Le Pharisien accomplit la loi, il reconnait le don de Dieu, mais il ne demande rien; c'est une sorte de riche dans sa religion, il est imbu de lui-même et méprise les autres (1,53).

Dans cette finale, Luc rappelle la loi du renversement des situations, caractéristique de la fin des temps (cf. déjà 1, 52-53 ; 6, 20-26). Dieu humiliera qui s'élève, et s'élèvera qui s'humilie. C'est que « ses pensées ne sont pas les pensées des humains, ses chemins ne sont pas les leurs » (Is 55,8)

Faith Communities "Census Weekend of Action" to Be Held March 27-29

Feb. 18, 2020 – The U.S. Census Bureau today convened faith-based leaders from around the country for the 2020 Census Interfaith Summit to discuss the importance of encouraging members of their communities to respond to the 2020 Census. Representing a diverse range of religions, leaders and attendees participated in a robust discussion with Census Bureau officials at the Washington National Cathedral in Washington, D.C.

"We partner with faith-based institutions and communities to get the word out about the importance of the 2020 census," said Census Bureau Director Dr. Steven Dillingham. "Faith leaders play an integral role in the community. They are the trusted voices, and in some cases in the hardest to reach communities they are the most trusted voice." Participants of the 2020 Census Interfaith Summit included leaders from the All Dulles Area Muslim Society (ADAMS) Center, the Catholic Health Association Sisters of Charity of St. Augustine, the African Methodist Episcopal Church, the National Latino Evangelical Coalition, and other diverse religious traditions and practices and national and regional faith-based organizations and institutions.

"Here at the cathedral, we firmly believe that every person is a beloved child of God that matters and should be seen and heard. That extends not only here at the cathedral, but across the country, and the census is a part of that," said Kevin Eckstrom, chief communications officer, Washington National Cathedral.

"It is vitally important that all people are counted in the census," explained Rev. Gabriel Salguero from the National Latino Evangelical Coalition. "Leaders in the Latino evangelical community are proud to do our part to ensure everyone is counted."

"American Muslims are a part of the American family. And for this very reason it's important for us to be counted," said Hurunnessa Fariad, All Dulles Area Muslim Society (ADAMS) Center. "We appreciate the Census Bureau's sensitivity in approaching the American Muslim community through its most trusted voices — it's faith leaders and faith institutions. It's these trusted voices that will make all the difference in ensuring our community is represented alongside others in the American democracy."

"The census is absolutely critical, especially to minority communities," said Bishop Reginald Jackson, African Methodist Episcopal (AME) Church, 6th District of Georgia. "Every 10 years our communities go undercounted. We lose out on millions of dollars for libraries, roads, community services, and more importantly, representation in Congress. It gives us a seat of power and a voice to be heard. It's so important that we as individuals, and as a community, be counted."

"Our Faith calls us to understand that people are made in the image and likeness of God. So to respect the dignity of the human person, we want to ensure that all that we're doing is in respect to that dignity. That's what the census is all about. We need people to be counted to ensure access to federal funding for health care, education, food, and transportation, and they have an ability to be represented in congress and at the state level. It's really about the dignity of the human person and having trust in the census process, because they themselves need to be counted. Their neighbors need to be counted. This community needs to be counted," said Sister Judith Ann Karam, CSA, Sisters of Charity of St. Augustine, Catholic Health Association.

"Jewish tradition reinforces the importance of societal welfare. So not only from the perspective of being counted, but also we are commanded to recognize the dignity of every person," said Rabbi Menachem Creditor, United Jewish Appeal (UJA) Federation. "As an American Jewish community, the census is our most urgent priority so that we might fulfill the command to love our neighbors as ourselves."

"There are so many reasons why it's important for us to be counted in the census, from congressional representation to distribution of funds," said Vikshu Kumar Gurung, founder of the Buddhist Society of Nebraska. "Partnering with the Census Bureau will help us address concerns of poverty, homelessness and hunger within our community. Public benefits and safety, child care, adult care, these are all benefits our communities need, and being part of the census will address these concerns, so it's very important for us to be counted in the 2020 Census."

Today's summit also highlighted the upcoming Faith Communities Census Weekend of Action, which will take place at houses of worship across the nation March 27-29, 2020. The Census Bureau established this decade's faith community's Census Weekend of Action as a coordinated opportunity for faith leaders to focus their outreach and support of the 2020 Census and encourage their communities to respond. Materials for faith-based leaders to encourage participation are available here.

This Faith Communities Census Weekend of Action is just before Census Day on April 1, the reference day people should use when responding to the 2020 Census. Most U.S. households will receive an invitation between March 12-20 with instructions on how to respond online, by phone or by mail. More information is available on how the 2020 Census will invite everyone to respond.

The U.S. Constitution mandates a census of the population every 10 years. Census statistics are used to determine the number of seats each state holds in the U.S. House of Representatives and to inform how billions of dollars in federal funds will be allocated by state, local and federal lawmakers. Effective immediately, the following changes will occur within our church and the Liturgy of the Mass.

As a health precaution, the Diocese of Rockville Centre instructs all Pastors, Clergy and Parishioners to enact the following measures immediately.

- 1. Until further notice, the Precious Blood of Christ (the Chalice) is not to be distributed to anyone other than clergy (priests/deacons).
- 2. Until further notice, the Sign of Peace will not be given or exchanged in any form during Holy Mass. A simple smile is not contagious.
- 3. Parishioners are instructed to remain at home if they are sick. This is a precaution for all who serve in any ministries withing the Liturgy of the Mass.
- 4. All Priest, deacons, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion and altar servers should use the hand sanitizers provided on both sides of the altar before serving. They should also be encouraged to wash and sanitize their hands before and after distribution of the Eucharist.
- 5. Holy Water fonts will be left empty till further notice. If you want Holy Water for your home, just bring the container in and one of the Priest or Deacons will bless the water for you.
- 6. We are asking all Parishioners to receive Holy Communion in their hands not on their tongues during this precautionary time.
- 7. We will make every effort to clean and disinfect our church and the pews as often as possible.
- 8. We ask all to refrain from greeting /handshakes, especially with Our Priest and Deacons before and after Masses at this time.

This information will appear regularly in our Parish Bulletin beginning this weekend. Thank you for your cooperation in enforcing these temporary changes.
