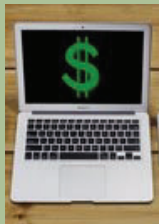

### Message from Our Pastor

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

We just celebrated the feast of All Saints, and we could see it as our anticipation of what is to come for ourselves; not because we are perfect as they are, but because God in his mercy will not reject anyone who is looking up to him to be saved. The Saints show us by the example of their lives, how to make it to heaven. And there, as Jesus says: "they can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God, because they are the ones who will rise." Jesus makes a strong stand about the gift of eternal life, and He leaves no space for doubt about it, because our God is the God of the living and not of the dead, for to God all are alive.

We continued our prayers on All Souls Day for our departed, because if they should have died and not be well prepared for meeting God, then in our prayers and offerings we make up for what they were lacking, and so we speed their process of purification in purgatory and admittance to heaven, to see God face to face as He is. When we pray for all of our faithful departed, we need to remember, that they are alive before God, and even when we can't see them, they are like the angels enjoying their new eternal life. Prayer is our way of communicating with God and with all the Saints, and with all our brothers and sisters who have died.

Some Saints were able to see heaven and hell as a fruit of their humble prayer and the Lord's invitation, and what they say about heaven is beautiful, but what they say about hell is scary. So maybe this is why the Lord does not want us to have such an easy access to the other world, because we would not necessarily know how to handle it. After seeing who is in heaven or hell, we would be afraid and confused about how people got there, and we would want God's explanations of what and why? We would be guessing and gossiping about what may have happened, rather than focusing on making our own decisions and choices. So Lord, we thank you for giving us our chance to show you our faith and our love for You. Let's live with courage, our own chance to become saints, that is the persons that love God and love other people. It seems possible and we can try it; the prize is heaven and being blessed already on earth.

Soon we will start thinking of Thanksgiving, and our family gatherings and great dinners, remembering all of God's blessings. As we prepare for that feast, let us remember to invite others to our table by sharing with them our resources, our food, our blessings. In those days our Outreach runs low on food, and one of the ways that we can support it, is by our direct gift of food. We can place it in the box at the entrance of the church or leave it by the statue of St. Anne. Jesus says: when you invite people to a dinner, invite those who can't give you back: the crippled, the blind, the lame, the unemployed, and since they can't give you back anything, then God will reward you for your kindness in heaven. It's simple, and yet it takes the mind to remember and a generous heart to be ready to give. Our giving is an expression of our believing. I want to thank the group of Young Adults who prepared enough candy bags for all children who came to church last weekend. It was done in the honor of All Saints, as Halloween is only a day ahead of All Saints feast day.

God bless America, God bless this immigrant nation for generosity to the strangers and the needy. Let us count our blessings, let us be grateful for them. As we go and vote in the elections, let us remember, that we need our religious freedom to be able to be who we are as Catholics and Christians, so please let's choose someone who will respect our catholic values, and let us practice our faith, without being pushed or obliged to participate in someone's immorality. Our freedom to express and practice our faith, is fundamental to us and to all people of good will. Let's pray for our country and let us participate in choosing our new leaders, it is our privilege and duty to choose whom we believe to be the better option, or if we don't like any candidate, than we should choose the one that we believe is the lesser evil.

## 32 DOMINGO TIEMPO ORDINARIO

Hoy, Jesús hace una clara afirmación de la resurrección y de la vida eterna. Los saduceos ponían en duda, o peor todavía, ridiculizaban la creencia en la vida eterna después de la muerte.

Una cosa es creer en la vida eterna y otra es imaginarse cómo será. El misterio que no está rodeado de respeto y discreción, peligra ser banalizado por la curiosidad y, finalmente, ridiculizado.

La respuesta de Jesús tiene dos partes. En la primera quiere hacer entender que la institución del matrimonio ya no tiene razón de ser en la otra vida: «Los que alcancen a ser dignos de tener parte en aquel mundo y en la resurrección de entre los muertos, ni ellos tomarán mujer ni ellas marido» (Lc 20,35). Lo que sí perdura y llega a su máxima plenitud es todo lo que hayamos sembrado de amor auténtico, de amistad, de fraternidad, de justicia y verdad...

El segundo momento de la respuesta nos deja dos certezas: «No es un Dios de muertos, sino de vivos» (Lc 20,38). Confiar en este Dios quiere decir darnos cuenta de que estamos hechos para la vida. Y la vida consiste en estar con Él de manera ininterrumpida, para siempre.

Además, «para Él todos viven» (Lc 20,38): Dios es la fuente de la vida. El creyente, sumergido en Dios por el bautismo, ha sido arrancado para siempre del dominio de la muerte. «El amor se convierte en una realidad cumplida si se incluye en un amor que proporcione realmente eternidad» (Benedicto XVI).

### 30eme Dimanche du Temp ordinaire C.

La parabole du pharisien et du publicain nous présente deux attitudes que nous connaissons très bien.

Le pharisien veut s'affirmer et démontrer sa supériorité. Il sent le besoin d'abaisser les autres qui sont «rapaces, injustes, adultères, ou encore qui sont comme ce publicain!» En affichant sa vertu orgueilleuse, il étale son mépris des autres. Il est centré sur lui-même et démontre un manque total de miséricorde, de bonté et d'amour.

Le publicain de son côté, commence sa prière avec le psaume 50 : « Mon Dieu, prends pitié du pauvre pécheur que je suis ». Il ne juge pas les autres, il se juge lui-même. Cet homme souffre de rejet et de solitude à cause de ses propres péchés. Collecteur d'impôts, il est à la solde des Romains. Il se fait escorter par les soldats pour obliger les pauvres gens à payer les lourdes taxes de l'Empire. Il n'a d'autres amis que ceux qui font le même métier que lui. Il est méprisé par les gens de son peuple et il se méprise lui-même pour le travail qu'il fait. Dans sa peine, il se tourne vers Dieu et s'en remet à lui.

Toute la leçon de la parabole repose sur deux mots qui sont soulignés au début et à la fin du texte : au début, le pharisien est convaincu « d'être juste ». A la fin, le publicain s'en retourne chez lui « justifié», ou « rendu juste » par le Seigneur.

Nous savons que Jésus aime tout le monde et ne fait pas de différence entre les personnes : il accueille aussi bien les pharisiens Nicodème et Simon, que Marie Madeleine, la pécheresse publique, les enfants, les malades, la femme adultère, la samaritaine, les veuves, les publicains et les pécheurs.

le Seigneur veut nous faire réfléchir sur la place que nous occupons dans notre monde et sur les relations que nous devons avoir avec Dieu et avec les autres.

La parabole de Jésus s'adresse à nous qui croyons être meilleurs que les autres et qui avons tendance à mépriser ceux et celles qui n'ont pas les mêmes valeurs religieuses, politiques et sociales que nous.
