Dear Sisters and Brothers,

As I write these words, it is already Tuesday evening, just after the funeral of my father, which was presided over by Bishop Robert Chrzaszcz, one of the auxiliary bishops of Krakow, with a few priest friends in concelebration. My journey home was long, as I left JFK with a four-hour flight delay due to snow and air traffic. We finally departed at 2:30 AM and arrived in Warsaw at 4:00 PM. I made it home on Monday at 9:30 PM Polish time, which was 3:30 PM in New York. I am thankful that the flight was not canceled. Thank you for your prayers! On Tuesday, the weather was good, and the funeral went smoothly. It was a blessing to see so many friends and family at the Mass and reception. In the homily, I referenced Bob Dylan's song, "Blowing in the Wind," particularly the line, "How many roads must a man walk down before you call him a man?" I spoke about this in a Christian sense, reflecting on how our lives are responses to this question, and how, after we die, it is only the whisper of the wind of the Holy Spirit that carries our history in the hearts of those who remember us. Everything else is gone with the past.

This Sunday's readings remind us of the power of God's Word to transform our lives. They teach us that when God's Word is received and understood, it brings life and joy. As members of Christ's body, we are called to live in harmony, each contributing to the mission of the Church.

In the first reading, Ezra gathers the people to proclaim the law of the Lord, reminding them of their identity as God's chosen people. As they listened, they were deeply moved, weeping at how far they had strayed from God. But Ezra and Nehemiah encourage them, saying, "Do not be sad, and do not weep. Today is holy to the Lord!" God's Word is not meant to burden us but to refresh our spirits, guide us, and fill us with joy. They call the people to celebrate, to share their blessings with those in need, and to draw strength from the Lord.

In St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians, we hear a powerful image of the Church as the body of Christ. He emphasizes that just as the body has many parts, each with its unique function, so too does the Church. Every member, regardless of their role, has eternal value and purpose. God has given each of us unique gifts to serve the Church and one another.

In the Gospel, Jesus stands in the synagogue, reads from the scroll of Isaiah, and proclaims, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." With these words, Jesus reveals His mission: to bring glad tidings to the poor, liberty to captives, sight to the blind, and freedom to the oppressed. This declaration outlines His ministry. Jesus doesn't just read the Scriptures; He embodies them. His life and work are the fulfillment of God's promises. Through Him, the Word of God becomes flesh and dwells among us.

This Gospel challenges us to ask: How do we respond to the Word of God? Do we allow it to shape our lives and inspire us to action? As followers of Christ, we are called to continue His mission, bringing hope, healing, and justice to the world. Scriptures remind us that God's Word is not just to be heard, but to be lived. It calls us to rejoice in His mercy, embrace our role in the body of Christ, and carry forward His mission. As we leave today's liturgy, let us be strengthened by the Word and empowered to be Christ's hands and feet in the world. "Rejoicing in the Lord must be your strength!" This is a reminder that hearing God's Word is an act of worship and transformation. It invites us to reflect on our lives, and calls us to rejoice because God's mercy is always greater than our failures.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas,

Mientras escribo estos comentarios, ya es martes por la noche, después del funeral de mi padre, que fue presidido por el obispo Robert Chrzęszcz, uno de los obispos auxiliares de Cracovia, acompañado de algunos sacerdotes amigos en concelebración. Al salir del aeropuerto JFK, mi vuelo se retrasó 4 horas debido a la nieve y al tráfico aéreo, y partimos a las 2:30 a.m., llegando a Varsovia a las 4:00 p.m. Llegué a casa el lunes a las 9:30 p.m., hora de Polonia, que correspondía a las 3:30 p.m. en Nueva York. Tuve suerte de que el vuelo no fuera cancelado. ¡Gracias por sus oraciones! El martes tuvimos buen clima y el funeral transcurrió sin inconvenientes. Fue una bendición ver a tantos amigos y familiares que asistieron a la Misa y a la recepción. En la homilía, utilicé algunas referencias a la canción de Bob Dylan “Blowing in the Wind”, especialmente la frase: “¿Cuántos caminos debe recorrer un hombre antes de que lo llores hombre?” la cual interpreté en un sentido cristiano. Nuestra vida es una respuesta a esta pregunta, y después de nuestra muerte, solo el susurro del viento del Espíritu Santo recuerda la historia de nuestra vida en los corazones de quienes nos recuerdan. Todo lo demás se pierde en el pasado.

Las lecturas de este domingo nos hablan del poder de la Palabra de Dios para transformar nuestras vidas. Nos recuerdan que la Palabra de Dios, cuando es recibida y comprendida, trae vida y alegría, y que como miembros del cuerpo de Cristo, estamos llamados a vivir en armonía, cada uno contribuyendo a la misión de la Iglesia.

En la primera lectura, Esdras reúne al pueblo para proclamar la ley del Señor, recordándoles su identidad como el pueblo elegido de Dios. Al escucharla, se conmovieron profundamente, llorando al darse cuenta de lo lejos que estaban de Dios. Pero Esdras y Nehemías les recuerdan: “¡No estén tristes ni lloren! ¡Hoy es un día santo para el Señor!” La Palabra de Dios no está destinada a ser una carga, sino a renovar nuestro espíritu, guiarnos y llenarnos de alegría. Ellos animan al pueblo a celebrar, a compartir sus bendiciones con los necesitados y a encontrar fortaleza en el Señor.

La carta de San Pablo a los Corintios nos ofrece una poderosa imagen de la Iglesia como el cuerpo de Cristo. Él enfatiza que, así como el cuerpo tiene muchas partes, cada una con su función única, así también es la Iglesia. Cada miembro, independientemente de su rol, tiene un valor y propósito eterno. Dios nos ha diseñado a cada uno con dones únicos para servir a la Iglesia y a los demás.

En el Evangelio, Jesús se levanta en la sinagoga, lee del rollo de Isaías y proclama: “Hoy se cumple esta Escritura que acaban de oír.” Con estas palabras, Jesús revela su misión: llevar buenas noticias a los pobres, libertad a los cautivos, vista a los ciegos y liberación a los oprimidos. Esta declaración marca el esquema de su ministerio. Jesús no solo lee las Escrituras; Él las encarna. Su vida y obra son el cumplimiento de las promesas de Dios. Por medio de Él, la Palabra de Dios se hace carne y habita entre nosotros.

Este Evangelio nos desafía a preguntarnos: ¿Cómo respondemos a la Palabra de Dios? ¿Permitimos que dé forma a nuestras vidas e inspire nuestras acciones? Como seguidores de Cristo, estamos llamados a continuar su misión, llevando esperanza, sanación y justicia al mundo. Las Escrituras nos recuerdan que la Palabra de Dios no es solo para ser escuchada, sino vivida. Nos invita a alegrarnos en su misericordia, a abrazar nuestro papel en el cuerpo de Cristo y a llevar adelante su misión en el mundo.

Al salir de la liturgia de hoy, dejémosnos fortalecer por la Palabra y empoderarnos para ser las manos y los pies de Cristo en el mundo.

“¡La alegría en el Señor debe ser su fortaleza!” Este es un recordatorio de que escuchar la Palabra de Dios es un acto de adoración y transformación. Nos invita a reflexionar sobre nuestras vidas, pero también nos llama a alegrarnos porque la misericordia de Dios siempre es mayor que nuestras fallas.

¡Que Dios los bendiga siempre!

Après avoir lu le texte d'Isaïe, un texte vieux de plusieurs siècles, Jésus ajoute simplement : «Aujourd'hui s'accomplit ce passage de l'Écriture.» C'est-à-dire, ce passage d'Écriture que nous venons d'entendre devient réalité maintenant. «L'Esprit du Seigneur est sur moi parce que le Seigneur m'a consacré par l'onction. Il m'a envoyé porter la Bonne Nouvelle aux pauvres, annoncer aux prisonniers qu'ils sont libres, et aux aveugles qu'ils verront la lumière, apporter aux opprimés la libération, annoncer une année de bienfaits.»

Le Christ rend l'Écriture vivante et vraie «aujourd'hui». Il se rapproche des pauvres et des pécheurs, guérit les malades, réintègre dans la communauté ceux et celles qui ont été mis au ban de la société, redonne la vue aux aveugles, proclame la bonne nouvelle du Royaume. C'est l'aujourd'hui de Dieu.

Et la question nous est posée : Est-ce que ce passage d'évangile peut aussi s'accomplir dans notre vie de tous les jours? Est-ce que l'Esprit Saint peut nous aider à annoncer la bonne nouvelle : à libérer ceux et celles qui sont prisonniers des stupéfiants, de l'alcool, des jeux de hasard; à visiter les malades et les personnes qui souffrent de solitude; à redonner la vue à ceux et celles qui sont déprimés et découragés?

Le Christ nous offre un exemple très coloré de cet «aujourd'hui de la Parole de Dieu» dans la parabole du bon Samaritain.

L'exemple du Christ, dans la synagogue de son village, nous invite aujourd'hui à rendre la parole de Dieu vivante et vraie dans notre vie de tous les jours. Cette parole devient alors «lumière pour nos pas», «chemin, vérité et vie», «création d'un ciel nouveau et une terre nouvelle». Cette parole, c'est aujourd'hui qu'elle s'accomplit.



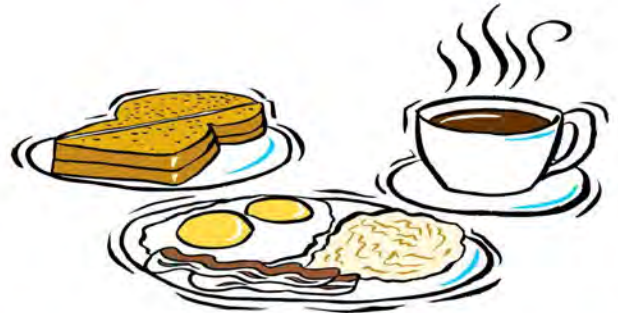
